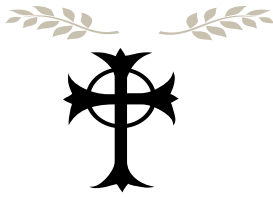

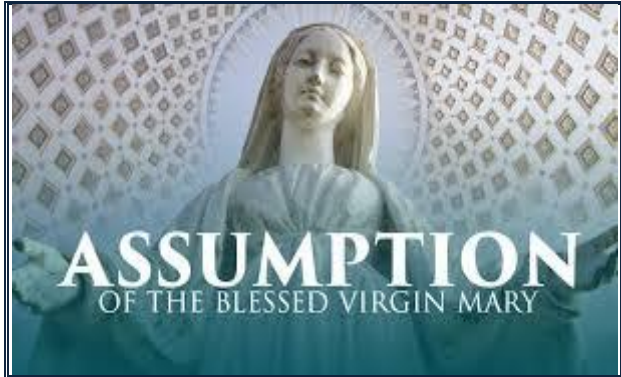

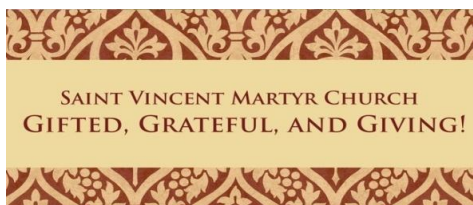

José de Arimatea: La Obra de Caridad

Esta semana terminaremos nuestra reflexión del capítulo 12 del libro De la Cruz a la Tumba Vacía, de nuestro obispo Serratelli, traducido a nuestra lengua.

“Fue más que un simple acto de piedad lo que incitó a José a enterrar el cuerpo de Jesús. Al presenciar los sufrimientos de Jesús, llega a amar al Señor aún más. No más miedo. *“El amor echa fuera el miedo”* (1 Juan 4, 18). Sepultar a Jesús muestra su acto de amor por el Señor. Tal amor asegura a José de Arimatea un lugar en todos los cuatro evangelios, así como en las escrituras apócrifas posteriores, que lo incluyen como un verdadero discípulo.

La fe en el Señor siempre conduce a obras de caridad. *“Así como el cuerpo sin el espíritu está muerto, así también la fe sin obras está muerta”* (Santiago 2, 26). Entre más grande es nuestra fe en Jesús, mayores son nuestros esfuerzos para hacer el bien a los demás”.

Continuaremos la próxima semana con otro capítulo.
