Thomas à Kempis, in *The Imitation of Christ*, says: “*You do not have to answer for others, but you must give an account of yourself; so why do you interfere where it does not concern you? One of our parishioners, Linda Wendelschafer, has been interested in the research work of the American Cancer Society (ACS) for many years. She has donated money, hoping for a cure for cancer diseases that have damaged or destroyed so many lives.

Five years ago she learned first-hand about the treatment support and assistance that ACS gives to cancer patients.

During a routine dental cleaning, her cousin's dentist identified a suspicious white spot on his gum. Further testing revealed stage 3, non-Hodgkin's mantle B-cell lymphoma. The treatment plan included an autologous stem cell transplant that would be covered by his medical



insurance. This treatment destroys the patient's immunities and requires isolation and intense daily chemotherapy at the hospital for several weeks. Not only was her family worried about her cousin's health, but the logistics and expense of living close to the hospital in Atlanta were big concerns. A patient representative at the oncologist's office suggested they stay at the ACS HOPE Lodge located on the Emory University campus. The facility provided each critically ill patient and their caregiver with a small 2 room apartment and a private bath. The facility provided several small shared kitchens with strict sanitation rules. As patients could not eat at restaurants or fast food facilities because of immunity concerns, HOPE Lodge provided small private pantries and sections of refrigerators and freezers. There were also refrigerator sections assigned to each patient and restricted to storage of medications.

For patients who needed transportation to and from treatment sessions at the hospital, ACS offered van service.

All HOPE Lodge services are supported by the ACS and are provided at no cost to the patients. The HOPE Lodge was an answer to her family's prayers and eased the stress of the cancer treatment.

Five years have passed since the American Cancer Society hosted her family at the HOPE Lodge. Her cousin is in full remission, works hard and celebrates life each day!

### **A Service of Shadows**

Walking through Scripture with Christ toward his death.

“Tenebrae” also known as the Service of Shadows, has been a part of the Roman Rite for centuries. Originally, this ceremony took the place in the late evening before or in the early morning hour on Maudy Thursday or on Good Friday as a service of prayer and song commemorating the Passion of Jesus Christ. Although the structure and style of the Tenebrae Service has been modified over the years in the Roman Rite and in other Christian Rites, the gradual extinguishing of the candles during the service, symbolizing light to darkness, remains the hallmark of Tenebrae.

Extinguishing the final candle symbolizes the death of Christ. This is followed by a loud noise or “streptitus” corresponding to the convulsion of nature when Christ dies.

The return of the “Christ” candle symbolizes the triumph of good over evil and the Resurrection.

## Georgia Heartbeat Bill
