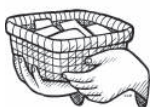

5 THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT OUR LADY OF MT. CARMEL AND THE BROWN SCAPULAR

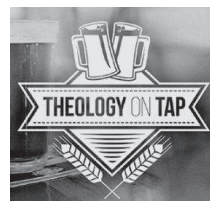

- 1. THE HISTORY:** Our Lady of Mt. Carmel is the Patroness of the Carmelite Order. The Feast of Our Lady under this title is July 16. Mt. Carmel, near the modern port city of Haifa, Israel, is not far from where Christ grew up. This had been a holy mountain long before the birth of Our Lord: in the 9th c. B.C. the Prophet Elijah (regarded as the Founder of the Carmelite order) challenged 450 false prophets of Baal on Mt. Carmel in a spiritual "duel" and then slew them (1 Kgs. ch. 18). By the Middle Ages it had become a home to Carmelite monks with a particular devotion to the Virgin Mary as their patroness. By the end of the 13th c. A.D. political and religious strife had caused the Carmelites to depart from Mt. Carmel and travel to Europe. Some Carmelites established monasteries as far north as England.
- 2. THE GREAT SCAPULAR PROMISE:** It was in England in the 13th c. that the Superior of the Carmelites, St. Simon Stock, received the Brown Scapular from Our Lady after having written the beautiful *Flos Carmeli* prayer (see below). St. Simon Stock was also given Mary's promise of final perseverance (dying in a state of Sanctifying Grace): "*Whoever dies wearing this scapular shall not suffer eternal fire.*" This assumes that one wearing it lives a good and upright life. The Carmelite Order wishes that people not dwell so much on the Scapular promise, but to recall the words of the great Carmelite Doctor of the Church, St. John of the Cross, "Strive to preserve your heart in peace; let no event of this world disturb it; reflect that all must come to an end."
- 3. WHY WE SHOULD WEAR IT:** According to Carmelite Fr. Kavanaugh, the Brown Scapular is not a good luck charm or an amulet; it is a garment that we wear as both a sign of our belonging to Mary and pledge of her maternal protection in this life. It is also a sign of three entwined elements: a) belonging to the Carmelite 'family, b) consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary and devotion to her, and c) an incentive to imitate Our Lady's virtues, especially her humility, chastity, and prayerfulness.
- 4. MAINTAINANCE:** Should we need to remove it, for repair or washing, there is no way that Our Lady would withhold her protection from us. It is wool, and to wash it, use mild hand soap or shampoo in warm water. If you lose it or it tears so that it can no longer be worn, burn it or bury it. Then obtain a new one and have a priest bless it.
- 5. EVANGELIZATION:** The Brown Scapular is a sign of "Mary's quiet presence." The quiet, unfailing love of our Blessed Mother is always with us, and we are silently reminded of this day after day. When memory fails, the slight tug of the Scapular's cords or the occasional itch of the wool against the skin is a quiet yet distinct reminder. Quiet as this sacramental may be, there are always the moments when someone will mention a curious tag sticking out the back of our shirts. Or someone more forward may actually come right out and ask about that 'thing' we are always wearing. In this moment, we can break the silence and give witness to the saving love of our Lord Jesus Christ and his mother's quiet love and devotion for all of her children.

"O Beautiful Flower of Carmel, most fruitful vine, splendor of heaven, holy and singular, who brought forth the Son of God, still ever remaining a pure virgin, assist us in our necessity. O Star of the Sea, help and protect us. Show us that you are our Mother. Amen."
