## Scripture Readings May 6, 2018 Sixth Sunday of Easter

#### First Reading: Acts 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48

Peter preaches to the Gentiles for the first time in the house of Cornelius. Peter realized that God would accept any person who acted uprightly, regardless of his or her heritage. Then the Holy Spirit descended on the Gentiles and Peter allowed them to be baptized in the name of Jesus.

#### Second Reading: I John 4:7-10

John advises all believers to love one another, for love is a gift from God. The person without love does not know God, whose love for us is so great he sent his only son so that we might have life through him.

## Gospel: John 15:9-17

Jesus asks his disciples to live on in his love and to "Love one another as I have loved you." He explains that he chose them to follow him, and promises if they keep his commandments they will have anything that they ask for in his name.

It is totally free for you to use and it is going to make it easy for you to stay plugged in to the activities of the parish via text message. It is something that people of all ages can use as long as you have a cell phone with texting abilities. Please know that your information is completely safe and secure.

FLOCKNOTE is very simple. Text the letters **SienaML** to the 5-digit phone number **84576.** Make sure your autocorrect on your phone does not mistakenly change the text. Once you send that in, FLOCKNOTE will send you back a confirmation message and a verification code with a link to enter the code. That's it! #### From the Desk of Fr. Jared



Recently, Pope Francis published an Exhortation, Apostolic Gaudete exsultate: Apostolic Exhortation on the call

to holiness in today's world. This is the third such document that the Holy Father has published in his Pontificate. An apostolic exhortation is a magisterial document written by the Pope that highlights key points about a particular issue. Typically, the Pope writes an Apostolic Exhortation after consulting with Bishops who participate in relevant synods. But that's not always the case. For example, after the Synod on the Family in 2016, Pope Francis published Amoris laetitia: Apostolic Exhortation on love in the family. That was the document that raised a lot of questions regarding marriage, divorce, and the reception of Holy Communion. It raised questions, but did not exactly answer them. That is the purpose of these documents. These documents are not infallible Church teaching. Rather, they highlight areas that require the Church's attention. An apostolic exhortation should establish a clear direction for Catholics to critically address issues that are being discussed within the Church and in modern society. It should not create more confusion.

Although I have only read part of the Pope's new exhortation, I recommend it to you to read. It can be found online at w2. Vatican. va. The call to holiness is such an important vocation for everyone. This was one of the most, if not THE most, important message of the Second Vatican Council. Holiness is a universal call. It is not only for a few select people or groups of people. To be holy does not require being a bishop, a priest or a religious. Pope Francis echoes, "We are frequently tempted to think that holiness is only for those who can withdraw from ordinary affairs to spend much time in prayer. That is not the case. We are all called to be holy by living our lives with love and by bearing witness in everything we do, wherever we find ourselves. Are you called to the consecrated life? Be holy by living out your commitment with joy. Are you married? Be holy by loving and caring for your husband or wife, as Christ does for the Church. Do you work for a living? Be holy by laboring with integrity and skill in the service of your brothers and sisters. Are you a parent or grandparent? Be holy by patiently teaching the little ones how to follow Jesus. Are you in a position of authority? Be holy by working for the common good and renouncing personal gain" (14). I hope you have a chance to at least skim through this document. It is addressed to each of us. We can "rejoice and be glad" for the Lord has chosen each of us to be holv. Peace,
