Second Reading: Romans 8:14-17

Gospel: Matthew 28:16-20

Jesus asks his disciples to go to other nations and teach others all that they have learned. He asks that these new followers be baptized in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

From the Desk of Fr. Jared

Happy Pentecost Sunday! Today is an opportunity to experience the presence and the power of the Holy Spirit. The roots of Pentecost can be found in the Jewish festival of Weeks (Shavuot), the fifty-day celebration following Passover. The Greek word for Pentecost (Pentekoste) means "fiftieth," and in early Christianity it referred to the entire fifty days of Easter. Early Christians reinterpreted the Jewish festival as a commemoration of the coming of the Holy Spirit since Acts records that the Holy Spirit came to the disciples when the festival of Pentecost was fulfilled (see Acts 2:1-11).

Pentecost celebrates not only the completion of Easter, but its fruition as we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit. "For, bringing your Paschal Mystery to completion, you bestowed the Holy Spirit today on those you made your adopted children by uniting them to your Only Begotten Son. This same Spirit, as the Church came to birth, opened to all peoples the knowledge of God and brought together the many languages of the earth in profession of the one faith" (Preface of Pentecost). These, then, are the themes we celebrate today: the completion of the Paschal Mystery, the coming of the Holy Spirit, adoption through union with Christ, and the communion of the Church and in faith.

With the completion of the Easter Season, we return to Ordinary Time on Monday and the Paschal Candle is returned to the Baptismal Font and is lit only for Baptisms and Funerals. "Come Holy Spirit. Fill the hearts of your faithful. Kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your spirit and they shall be created and you shall renew the face of the earth. Amen."
