**Scripture Readings**

**June 10, 2018**

**10<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time**

**First Reading: Genesis 3:9-15**

God asked Adam why he ate the fruit from the forbidden tree. Adam blames his companion, who in turn blames a serpent. God then told the serpent it would be banned from other animals and be an enemy of humanity.

**Second Reading: II Corinthians 4:13—5:1**

Paul describes our belief that, "He who raised up the Lord Jesus will raise us up along with Jesus." Although our bodies grow weaker, each day our inner strength grows. Paul also describes our burdens as light when compared to the eternal rewards we can attain.

**Gospel: Mark 3:20-35**

Some of the scribes felt that Jesus was possessed and claimed that he expelled demons with help from Satan. Jesus silenced them by asking, "How can Satan expel Satan?" Jesus also warned them that although many sins would be forgiven, blasphemy against the Holy Spirit would not. Jesus was then told that his mother, brother and sisters were asking for him. He asked, "Who are my mother and brother and sisters? Whoever does the will of God is brother and sister and mother to me." This demonstrates Jesus' deep love for all those who love God.

**PRIESTLY ANNIVERSARIES**

This time of year we always celebrate Ordination anniversaries. Please congratulate and pray for our priests.

Fr. Jared was ordained by Bishop Serratelli on May 28, 2011. This year he celebrated seven years. Fr. Edward was ordained by Bishop Rodimer on June 12, 1993. This year he celebrates his 25th anniversary. We will celebrate with Fr. Ed in the parish on Sunday, July 29 at 11:30 am. Fr. Jim was ordained by Bishop Casey on May 30, 1970 and this year celebrates his 48<sup>th</sup> anniversary. We celebrate them and are grateful for their service to us here at St. Catherine's and the larger Church.



### **From the Desk of Fr. Jared**

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi). It is the third and final special Solemnity that we celebrate after the Easter Season, following Pentecost and Trinity Sunday. Today's Solemnity gives us the opportunity to highlight in a special way our acknowledgement and celebration of the Eucharist as the center of our life and of our worship as Catholics. Vatican II reminds us that the Eucharist is the "source and summit of the Christian life" (*Lumen Gentium* 11). We can never tire from renewing our faith in the richness and depth of the mystery that at Mass the offerings of bread and wine really and truly become the Real Presence of Christ, His Body and Blood. It is the hallmark of our Catholic faith. Do we celebrate the Eucharist with great reverence? This is reflected in different ways: responding to the prayers, singing the hymns, being present in the moment, how we dress, how and when we receive or do not receive Communion.

There always seems to be great discussion or debate over who "should not receive communion." That is a difficult conversation to have. I believe that it is more beneficial to discuss who receives Communion, rather than who cannot. The reception of Holy Communion is the outward sign of the unity of Catholics. As Catholics, we are different. We are not Jewish. We are not Muslim. We are not any other Christian denomination. We are different and there is nothing wrong with that. The sign of this difference, the sign of our communion, is the reception of the Eucharist, the unique Catholic belief in the real presence of Jesus. Therefore, when we are not in communion, we are asked not to receive Communion out of respect for this unique tenet of the Catholic faith. What makes us "in communion"? We are in communion when we are baptized and believe in the Eucharist as the Church teaches, when we respect the Tradition of the Church as is inspired by the Holy Spirit and passed down through the Popes and Bishops, and when we are in a state of grace; that is when we are not aware of any serious sin that breaks our relationship with God completely, either privately or publicly.

We are not to "police" the communion line, but rather trust that we all understand and respect this great gift of the Church. Let us pray for a deep appreciation and respect for the gift of the Eucharistic Lord and always celebrate and receive with great devotion and in good conscience.
