### **NEWS FROM THE RELIGIOUS EDUCATION OFFICE**

**Religious Education registration** has opened. Please note that registration forms have been **emailed**; you can also print the forms from the website.

We have an exciting Religious Education year coming up in the fall. We will have a new format for First Grade students. It will be a pilot year for "class attached to Mass". This will allow families to make a connection from classroom catechesis to Mass. The class will meet Sundays at the 9:30 am Mass followed by classroom instruction ending at 11:00. It will also include Family Faith sessions, such as Advent and Lenten family days.

New this year, Grade Family Masses will replace the Class Masses. There will be (2) Grade Family Masses scheduled per grade. Families will sit together at Mass to celebrate the Eucharist.
