October 14, 2018
Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Wisdom 7:7-11

This poem discusses how the spirit of wisdom is far more beautiful than any riches could be. All gold is no more than sand when compared to the importance of wisdom, which often leads people to the other good things in life.

Second Reading: Hebrews 4:12-13

God's perception of people is called "sharper than any two-edged sword." God is able to know the thoughts and feelings of all his people. We can hide nothing from him, and will need to account for all he has seen in us.

Gospel: Mark 10:17-30

A man asks Jesus how he can share in everlasting life. Jesus tells him to sell his possessions and travel with them. The man refuses and Jesus tells his disciples how difficult it is for a rich person to enter heaven if they are too concerned with their possessions. The disciples remind Jesus that they gave up everything for him, and he assures them they will be rewarded with everlasting life.

From the Desk of Fr. Jared

What was the Second Vatican Council? If you had to sum up the central theme of that Council, what would you say? Often when asked to do that the immediate response is: the Mass went from Latin to the vernacular (in our case English).

The liturgical reform always ranks high on the list. There was a total of sixteen documents that resulted from the Vatican Council. Only one (*Sacrosanctum Concilium*) directly addressed the liturgy. Therefore, the Council had to be about more than the liturgy. I would suggest that the central theme that threads throughout all sixteen documents is the universal call to holiness as it is related to the universal call to mission. We are called to holiness because of our baptism.

It is often said that actions speak louder than words. Fr. Mallon writes in *Divine Renovation*, "Without actions, our words are not believed by our cynical post-modern, post-Christian society, but without words, our actions are not understood." Pope Paul VI, who will be canonized on October 14), said, "There is no true evangelization if the name, the teaching, the life, the promises, the kingdom and the mystery of Jesus of Nazareth, the Son of God are not proclaimed" (*Evangelii Nuntiandi* 22). Pope Saint John Paul II said, "This passion will not fail to stir in the Church a new sense of mission, which cannot be left to a group of 'specialists' but must involve the responsibility of all the members of the People of God. Those who have come into genuine contact with Christ cannot keep him for themselves, they must proclaim him" (*Novo Millennio ineunte* 40).

Evangelization is the responsibility of all disciples. All the baptized are called to be missionary disciples. Pope Benedict XVI said, "the goal of evangelization is "the realization of a personal encounter with Jesus Christ" (*Lineamenta* 11). Why we do what we do as disciples is to experience a personal encounter with the living God. Pope Francis has continued this call to discipleship, mission, and personal encounter with Jesus Christ.

What does it all mean? You are invited to learn more this fall at our Adult Faith Enrichment Series where we will discuss this mission. We continue this week on Tuesday evening at 7pm or Thursday morning at 10:30am. All are welcome!

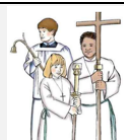
