# Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### First Reading: Isaiah 53:10-11

Isaiah speaks of how the Servant of God will have to give his life up for the sins of other people. Because of this suffering, the Servant will receive eternal life for himself and all the people whose sins are forgiven because of him.

#### Second Reading: Hebrews 4:14-16

Jesus is considered to be the new high priest and mediator between God and his people. Fortunately, Jesus has experienced the same temptations as other people, and so he has more tolerance of our weaknesses.

### Gospel: Mark 10:35-45

Two of the disciples ask Jesus that they be allowed to sit at his right and left side when he comes into his glory. Jesus explains that they should not be concerned with their position. Instead they should concern themselves with serving others just as Jesus was planning to serve many in giving his own life for their sins.

#### From the Desk of Fr. Jared

During the conclave that elected him Pope, Cardinal Jorge Bergoglio wrote that the Church is called to "come out of itself and to go to the peripheries." He warned that if the Church does not "go out", it becomes sick.

The Church does not seek to glorify Christ, but rather itself. Therefore, it becomes "sick." The Church forgets its mission to be a missionary Church. The Church is wounded in different ways. The Church needs healing. The first step is to acknowledge this woundedness and the need for healing. The pain in the Church is the result of abuse scandals, closing of parishes, schools, and clustering of other parishes. Denial of our pain and sorrow is not an option.

Fr. Mallon, in *Divine Renovation*, distinguishes between pain and suffering. Pain, in and of itself, does not lead to life. Pain grappled with is suffering. Suffering is redemptive. What is redemptive suffering? You are invited to learn more at our fall Adult Faith Enrichment Series where we will discuss this mission. We continue this week on Tuesday evening at 7pm or Thursday morning at 10:30am. All are welcome!

# Why does the priest break a piece of the Host into his chalice before communion?

Centuries ago, the Bishop of a diocese would celebrate daily Mass with his priests. After that liturgy, each priest would take a piece of the consecrated host to his parish. Later that day, when he celebrated Mass with his parishioners, he would drop that host into the chalice to symbolize unity with the Bishop. Today, that act reminds us of our unity with our Bishop as well as reminding us that Christ's Body and Blood are united in the Eucharist.
