First Reading: Jeremiah 31:7-9

From the Desk of Fr. Jared

Pope Francis speaks about temptations against missionary discipleship. There are attitudes, ideas, and perspectives that prevent us from "going out." Fr. Mallon in *Divine Renovation* speaks about Pelagianism and Jansenism. These are two heresies of the Church. The former is the belief that there is no need for God's grace and that human beings can take of everything, including salvation, on their own. The latter is the belief that human beings are so sinful that we are never worthy and there is nothing we can do to bring about salvation. He reminds us that we can do something in cooperation with the grace of God. By nature of our Baptism, we are empowered to become missionary disciples and saints. Missionary disciples go out from themselves, inviting some to return to the Church and others to enter for the first time.

You are invited to learn more this fall at our Adult Faith Enrichment Series where we will discuss this mission. We continue this week on Tuesday evening at 7 pm or Thursday morning at 10:30 am. All are welcome!

What is the purpose of the oils that are on the wall to the right side of the altar?

The Holy Oils are stored in an ambry and are used in the sacramental life of the Church. There are three kinds of holy oil: Oil of Catechumens (OC), Oil of the Infirm (OI), and the Sacred Chrism (SC). The OC is used as a pre-baptismal anointing for those to be baptized. The OI is used to anoint the sick. The SC is used for the post-baptismal anointing, Confirmation, and Holy Orders.
