Sixth Sunday of Easter

First Reading: Acts 15:1-2, 22-29
 Some men informed the Gentiles that they must be circumcised if they wished to be saved, because of the Old Laws. Disciples then went forth to tell the Gentiles to honor only those rules which were strictly necessary, such as abstaining from eating meat sacrificed to idols and illicit sexual union.

Second Reading: Revelation 21:10-14, 22-23
 John depicts Jerusalem coming out of heaven, sparkling with the radiance of precious jewels. Angels were stationed at each of its twelve gates, and each gate bore the name of one tribe of Israel. The city had no temple, because God was its temple. The glory and light of God and the Lamb also replaced their need for the sun.

Gospel: John 14:23-29
 Jesus tells his disciples, "Anyone who loves me will be true to my word." For those who do honor his word, both Jesus and God will love them and stay with them always. He also tells them that God will send the Holy Spirit in his place to give them the instructions they will need. Jesus then tells them that peace is his farewell gift to them.

Eucharistic Adoration

The Eucharist is the greatest gift that the Church gives to us. It is Jesus himself; Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity, that we encounter in the Eucharist. In the celebration of the Eucharist (Mass) we receive Jesus. In the tabernacle, Jesus is reposed and we are able to spend time in prayer before him. Sometimes, the Blessed Sacrament is exposed and we have an opportunity to adore and pray before the exposed Blessed Sacrament. That is a unique and very intimate opportunity. Each Monday we have that opportunity to sit and bask in the Eucharistic presence from 12:30pm-8pm. Where there is adoration offered in a parish, the parish is transformed and renewed. That is the power of the Eucharist and prayer!

Suggestions to be Successful in Adoration

1. Be Patient

Sometimes, in adoration, time seems to stand still. Five minutes seem eternal. Have you ever been out of shape and tried to go for a one mile run? Suddenly, five minutes into the run, you're huffing and puffing and you realize you've only gone one block. Rather than focusing on the success — you just ran for the first time in months!! — we tend to focus on the defeat. Adoration can be a bit of a work out... for your soul. So, set yourself up for success. If it's been awhile, or your first time, 5 minutes of sitting with Jesus is a good goal. Slowly increase your time—you'll be amazed at how God increases your capacity to be with Him!

2. Bring Scripture

Reading scripture is always a good thing, but is especially helpful and meditative during adoration. There are many prayer books and apps that contain daily scripture readings. As you read scripture ask yourself: How is this scripture speaking to my heart? What changes is God asking me to make? How will I go about making those changes? That is prayer.

3. Be Okay with Silence

It's so easy to go a whole day without silence. We get in the car and turn on the radio, we have our phones in our pockets always vibrating and ringing, and at the end of the day there's Netflix. Even if we are in a quiet environment, we are usually accustomed to checking our phones—for a text, the latest Facebook update, the trending hashtag on Twitter, the newest picture on Instagram, the list goes on. St. Augustine said that we will be restless until we rest in God. Silence can even cause a little restlessness. Soon you will be filled with insurmountable peace. Allow yourself to sit in silence and to just be with Jesus.

What scriptural readings are proclaimed at Mass?

Sunday Mass includes two readings (the first excerpted from the Old Testament, except during Easter, and the second from a New Testament letter) and the Gospel, while daily Mass usually has one reading and the Gospel. A responsorial psalm is said or sung in between the readings. In addition to the Liturgy of the Word, scripture is intertwined into all of the prayers of the Mass.
