Scripture Readings
June 23, 2019
Corpus Christi

First Reading: Genesis 14:18-20
 Melchizedek, a priest of God, prayed that Abram would be blessed by God. He also praised God for delivering Abram's foes into his hands.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 11:23-26
 Paul describes Jesus' actions during the last supper. Jesus broke bread and said it was his body given for us, asking that we do the same in remembrance of him. He then passed the cup and called it his blood. Jesus then asked us to break bread in this manner to remember his death until he returns.

Gospel: Luke 9:11b-17
 Jesus spoke to a large crowd when his disciples asked that he dismiss the people to give them a chance to find food and lodging. Jesus asked the disciples to give the crowd something to eat, but they had only five loaves of bread and two fish. Jesus then blessed and distributed the food, which fed about 5,000 people. Twelve baskets were then collected from what was left over.

Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

Today the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. Our celebration allows us to focus on the central belief of Christianity, that of the Trinity — that God is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We often say, “In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.” Those words express a powerful mystery!

The Mass prayers for this Solemnity give us deeper insight into the mystery. The Collect (Opening Prayer) expresses the meaning of the mystery in terms of the activity of the triune God: the Father sends into the world the Word of truth and the Spirit of sanctification and, in so doing, reveals to the human race his own “wondrous mystery.” The prayer affirms that through the Trinity we know the very life of God Himself.

The Prayer over the Offerings makes the important liturgical point that as we make the offering of our lives at this liturgy — “this oblation of our service” — its ultimate purpose is that by it we might be made “an eternal offering” to the Father. The prayer expresses how in the liturgy we are swept up into the life of the Trinity so that as the Catechism states, “By uniting ourselves with his sacrifice we can make our lives a sacrifice to God” (2100).

The Preface (the section of the Eucharistic Prayer before the “Holy, Holy”) emphasizes the theological truth of God being “one God, one Lord, not in the unity of a single person, but in a Trinity of one substance.” It also emphasizes how each Person of the Trinity is equal in majesty. Finally, the Prayer after Communion also gives voice to the basic statement about the Trinity being “undivided Unity,” a truth echoed in a well-known hymn. So, while the Trinity is a great mystery, the prayers of the liturgy can help us to understand it just a little bit better.

Father’s Day Collection

This weekend, our second collection is for Seminarian Education. This is an additional way to support our future spiritual Fathers. We have the unique opportunity to see seminarians first-hand. Sebastian and Carlos are a sign of hope for our Church. We have a role in their formation; helping them in a special way to adapt to a new culture. Support of this collection is an affirmation of their decision to study for the Priesthood and an acknowledgement of their call to serve God by serving His people. As always, thank you for your kindness.

Catholic Heart Work Camp Youth Trip

This year ten teenagers of our parish will once again participate in *Catholic Heart Work Camp*. The week of July 14-20, they will be traveling to Boston. This is our third year participating in this “faith in action” trip. This summer, over 13,000 participants will serve throughout the country in different cities. *CHWC* provides teenagers and adult leaders service opportunities to restore homes,

feed the hungry, lift the spirits of children, and bring joy to the lonely. Each “camp” is equipped with a staff, director, manager, musician, nurse, and priests to celebrate the Sacraments. Participants have an opportunity to share their faith with peers, increase their faith through catechesis and prayer, and put their faith into action by working each day in different locations and capacities. I am grateful to all of you for your support of our young people on this experience. Please continue to pray for them as their faith is strengthened and put into practice.
