THE EXPERIENCE OF DAILY MASS

There is a special place in our community where a person of faith can enjoy a daily retreat; a place of peace and a pocket of time away from all other events and distractions; a place to feel comfortable and secure but not alone; a place for necessary introspection yet with a sense of fellowship and belonging; a place to find the insights for difficult decisions, or simply to rejoice over something that has gone well; a relaxed atmosphere in which to gain intellectual stimulation and spiritual nourishment. That place is the experience of daily worship.

The daily liturgy reinforces our values, brings balance, and centers us for the rest of the day. I predict that others too in this group of worshippers are discovering the guidance needed for the everyday struggles of their lives – serious illnesses and care of the elderly, financial pressures and doubts, to name only a few of life's pressures.

At the same time, daily worship need not be solely a plea for God's intervention during troubled times. It affords the opportunity, beyond the once-a-week Sunday observance, to express gratitude. Taking time to worship on a daily basis when something good has happened tends to make us more aware of God's presence, his influence in our lives and makes us feel uplifted and blessed.

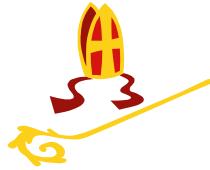
EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION

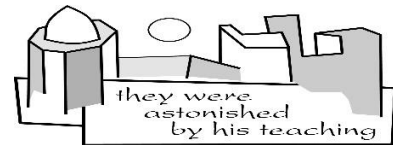

NEXT WEEKEND'S READINGS:

FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



First Reading: Jeremiah 1:4-5, 17-19

God tells Jeremiah that he was chosen to be a prophet to the nations before he had even been born. He also promises him strength and protection, providing Jeremiah does as God asks.

Second Reading: 1 Cor 12:31—13:13

Paul discusses the importance of love and claims that one who possesses any gift, but lacks love, has nothing. He explains that true love never fails, although knowledge or other talents can fail to endure in the same manner. Paul says that three things last: "faith, hope, and love, the greatest of these being love."

Gospel: Luke 4:21-30

Jesus spoke in the synagogue at Nazareth, at first appealing to all who were present. But he knew that they would be expecting him to do the things he had already done in other towns. He reminded them of other prophets who had preached and gained acceptance in foreign places instead of their home towns. This angered the people, who expelled him from town.
