### VALENTINE'S DAY THOUGHTS

The commercial world will make this their biggest target since Christmas. We are encouraged to show our affection and love for others by giving them flowers, candy and cards decorated with hearts.

All of this fanfare makes me think about the true meaning of love. Do we really have it right? Speaking about love is a bold undertaking, and I am certainly aware of all I do not know.

In terms of relationships, we have all taken our turn trying to figure out what works and what does not. If we are blessed, people enter our hearts and there they remain. The kind words we speak are sincere; our need for affection and belonging is understood. On the contrary, if we act in a way that pushes people away, we diminish ourselves and become cut off from what was once their love and goodness. If you want to guarantee relationships well into old age, remember that love must be expressed in thoughts, words, but mostly in deeds.

Beyond our own home lives, we have parish family and faith community. We have the teachings in the Scriptures and the witness in the lives of holy men and women. Love does indeed make the world go round. This is one of the great truths. Love in dreams is easy. Love in real life is often a more demanding reality. It is easy to fall victim to the Hollywood myth that real love is romantic love. We are surrounded by messages that tell us love is a feeling and that intimacy develops quickly. But after the emotions of delight have had their full play and life drops back into its normal slot there is much anxiety about romantic love. It can and usually does change. It often slips away. And it seldom works as advertised.

The path of real love invites us to follow a path that will change our hearts into a compassionate space that looks for the good in other people and asks us to live beyond ourselves. This type of love happens through a process, often slow and steady, deep within the human soul. Then we begin to notice that what matters most in life are the sacrifices we are making for others and for God, and doing them with a joyful and loving heart!

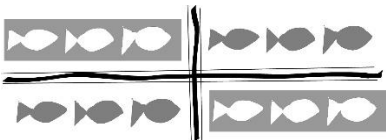

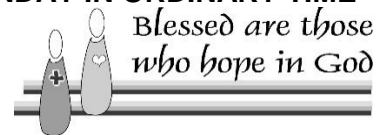

## NEXT WEEKEND'S READINGS:

### SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



#### First Reading: Jeremiah 17:5-8

Jeremiah compares a man who seeks strength in flesh but abandons God to a bush in the desert, bereft of nourishment and unable to grow. Yet a man who trusts in God is like a tree beside a river, fed & strengthened by it even during times of drought.

#### Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:12, 16-20

Paul addresses those who believe in Christ's teachings, but are not convinced that he rose from the dead. He calls their faith worthless, because they have not been freed from their sins. Paul then emphatically declares that Jesus did rise up again, as will all those who truly believe in him.

#### Gospel: Luke 6:17, 20-26

Jesus tells his followers that those who are insulted in this life because of him will be rewarded richly in heaven. Yet those well received by all will despair in heaven, since people had often respected false prophets and mistreated true prophets. Those who hunger, perhaps for spiritual knowledge, shall be filled. Yet those who are full in this life will be hungry.
