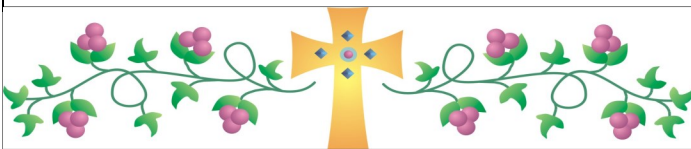

GETTING BACK INTO THE SWING OF THINGS.....

Now that a new school year has begun many people will perhaps be back into a more routine pace of life. We prayed at Masses last weekend and at daily Mass this past week for students and teachers returning to school, that there may be many opportunities to grow in holy wisdom. We keep in prayer the children from our parish, especially those who are beginning in new schools or who have started the formal process of classroom education for the first time. May God keep them safe so that they may continue to grow to know their gifts and talents which He has placed within them.

In the early Christian community it was understood that the gifts and talents of each person were given by the Holy Spirit in order to be given for the good of the entire community. *The community of believers was of one heart and mind, and no one claimed that any of his possessions was his own, but they had everything in common. Acts 4:32.* In the life of the parish there are many opportunities for an individual to be of use to others. At this time of year we begin programs of training and education. Next Saturday there will be a training session for children in 3rd grade and above who would like to serve at the Altar. In the near future we will have training and refresher sessions for Lectors and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Fuller explanations of these ministries and the relevant contact information is to be found on our parish website. Teri Kesselmeyer has spent much time and creativity using her gifts to enhance the website which contains a wealth of information on parish events and opportunities. As the old adage says: don't just sit there, do something.

Over the last months we have been blessed with the beautiful voice of Elena Bird Zolnick at the 8:30 and 10:30 AM Masses. When Katerina, the cantor of those Masses, moved out of state she recommended Elena to me. Initially it was for the summer but I am pleased to inform you that Elena has decided to become more involved in our music ministry. In a recent conversation with Vincent Clarke we discussed how impressive Elena's resume and experience in Sacred Music is. Elena graduated from Florida State University with a Masters in Voice Performance, and from the University of Colorado with a Bachelor's of Music in Voice Performance. Previously she was Director of Music at the First Presbyterian of New Vernon, Ensemble director/cantor/pianist at the Co-Cathedral in Tallahassee, Florida and has an impressive list of accomplishments with Ensembles, Choral Societies, and Opera performance. With this experience and gifts I am delighted that Elena will also take over as Director of Music with the responsibility of planning music for our liturgies, recruiting and training choir members, and organizing instrumentalists for our major liturgical celebrations. Welcome Elena and thank you for bringing your gifts and talents to our parish.

In the area of faith formation, sessions for the children will begin in October and we look forward to a great year. The Faith Formation Office is now located in the Faith Formation and Pastoral Center (former school) and Deirdre, Sr. Krystyna and Maria may be reached there at 908-647-0421. Under the title of, Getting Ready for Sunday, I will begin a program on Thursday afternoon from 2-3:30 PM which will be repeated on Thursday evening from 7:30-9 PM in the Faith Formation and Pastoral Center to offer a deeper insight into the Scriptures to be proclaimed at Sunday Mass and a deeper understanding of the Mass itself. Understanding the readings in context, their development, historical perspective and the cultural practices at the time in which they were written will help the readings come alive each Sunday for you. In addition, examining the history, development and the various parts of the Mass will aid in developing a deeper love and reverence for the central sacred ritual of our faith. The first sessions will be offered on Thursday, September 15th (this week) and will continue throughout the year with the exception of holidays.

Today we must pause to reflect on the 15th anniversary of the terrorist attacks of 9/11/2001. So much terrorism continues in this world which is fraught with the tension of evil and sin. We remember those who die in these acts of hatred and commend them to the God of consolation and peace. We pray for their loved ones who mourn with the promise that one day they will be comforted. We pray for ourselves, that we may use the time we have, our gifts, and talents for the good of the Kingdom of God and so one day be counted among the Saints in the Communion of Eternal life and love.

READINGS FOR NEXT SUNDAY

First Reading: Amos 8:4-7 The prophet Amos expressed disgust over people who take advantage of the poor. He describes businessmen scheming to cheat the poor, then declares that God will "never forget the things they have done."

Second Reading: 1 Timothy 2:1-8 Paul urges the Christians to pray for all people, especially those in authority. Paul even asked them to pray for the kings who denounced Christ's teachings, because God wants all people to be saved through Jesus.

Gospel: Luke 16:1-13 Jesus tells a story about a servant who tries to cheat his employer. The owner is impressed because he would do the same thing himself. Jesus then describes the importance of being trustworthy in small matters, as well as in greater ones. He then states that no one can serve two masters faithfully, so people cannot give themselves completely to both God and money.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL CEMETERY

The following are not permitted on cemetery grounds: artificial flowers, plastic or ceramic statues, vigil lights, trees, shrubs, ivy grave coverings and stands, metal legs or hooks for potted plants. Flowerbeds are permitted, running the width of a headstone and extending one foot off the monument base. Modest fencing of flowerbeds is allowed. Masonry or any other fencing around flower beds considered obtrusive or hazardous is not permitted. Maintenance of permitted plantings is the sole responsibility of the family. Any decorations, plantings or borders not permitted may be removed at any time. All rules subject to change upon consideration for the safety of those who visit and for aesthetic or religious reasons.

The rules above are posted in the cemetery and given to those who purchase plots. There are a number of situations in which the rules have been ignored. Trees and shrubs which have been planted will compromise foundations and eventually cause monuments to topple. As stated above, masonry borders and fencing is prohibited. Both these infractions are potential safety hazards. In addition, these violations interfere with the upkeep of the cemetery.

Therefore, beginning **October 1, 2016** we will be removing trees and shrubs from the cemetery and removing any permanent masonry flower bed borders. For those with plots in the cemetery, you have the option of removing or transplanting trees and shrubs yourself prior to **October 1**. You also have the option of removing any permanent borders and replacing them in accordance with the rules stated. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated as we strive to maintain our parish cemetery.

ARE YOU REGISTERED TO VOTE?

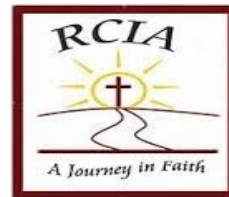

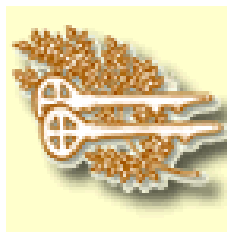
