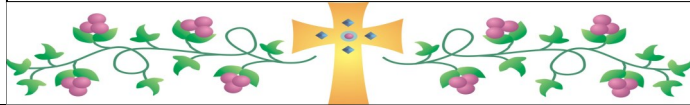

**THOSE WHO SERVE AND THE ONES WHO BENEFIT**

This weekend we host our parish Volunteer Appreciation Night. It is a time for the volunteers of the parish to gather and to spend time with fellow parishioners and to be recognized for the sharing of their gifts and talents for the good of this faith community. There are so many who, week after week, by their participation in the ministerial life of the parish allow for such great good to take place. To all who use their gifts and talents in service to the mission of the parish—**THANK YOU**.

In that same vein I express gratitude to George Rachmiel (*Finance Committee*) and Tim Wallisch (*Trustee and Finance Committee*) for all the work they have put in recently in the process of what will be a great good for the capital improvement of the parish. The parking lots on our campus have sorely been in need of repaving and repair along with the stone work which curbs the campus. George and Tim have spearheaded the endeavor to address that important issue. Working with an engineer recommended by the Diocese they worked diligently with paving companies and solicited bids for the work. The Diocesan Business Office requires that we have a minimum of 3 bids on such projects. We invited 7 companies to submit bids, 5 did. Some of the companies were recommended by the Diocesan Business Office and parishioners who own businesses and have had the need to repave on a commercial scale. Others were known to us from work carried out in our region. Once the final bids were submitted they were opened and read. Two were chosen. George and Tim met with the contractors to finesse the end product. After that meeting, one was offered the job and accepted. The project will cost \$175,000. The monies will come from rebates from the Diocesan Capital Campaign and money set aside for Capital Improvements. We will not have to borrow, which is a blessing, but we will need to build up our reserves again. This is an important project and so we needed to allocate what was available to cover it. The parish Finance Committee, when presented with all the information, endorsed the project.

Once all that was done, all the bids we received, along with a request to spend money to repair, were sent to the Diocese. Diocesan Financial Guidelines state that when a proposed project is estimated to cost *between \$100,000 but less than \$571,000 approval must come from the Diocesan College of Consultors after agreement between the Pastor and the Parish Finance Council*. The information was shared with the Diocesan Business Office who approved the project, as well as the Diocesan Business and Facilities Project Manager, Dennis Rodano. On Monday the information was sent to the Diocesan College of Consultors for their approval. The College of Consultors is a diocesan body of priests who are appointed to five-year, rotating, renewable terms. Canon law requires the Bishop to consult with his College of Consultors before making certain decisions. Approval was given today (Tuesday) for the repaving of our parking lots to take place. Preliminary work should begin on Monday of this week. I expect that there will not be too much interruption to our daily schedule here while the work is taking place.

I am truly indebted to George and Tim for all their work and guidance in this big project. I am also most thankful to those who contributed to the Diocesan Capital Campaign and who continue to keep their pledge as you have enabled your parish, through rebate, to take on this most essential task of maintenance. I am also grateful to each of you who sacrificially contribute to the collection which, while allowing us to continue the mission and programs we offer here, also allows for projects like this to be undertaken. This is a most necessary project as we strive to keep our facilities up to date, safe and accessible.

As we celebrate those who volunteer I am reminded that our gratitude and prayer should be offered to those who are so good and generous with their time and talent in the parish. Their service is a true commitment of love to Christ and to the mission of this parish. Really only God is capable of rewarding such love. I am often reminded of the words of St. John of the Cross: "In the evening of life, we will be judged on love alone." May those who give so much to this parish receive from the most merciful of judgments for all the love they live in action and service. Once again, prayerful thanks to all our amazing volunteers.

**ARE YOU A REGISTERED PARISHIONER ?**

If you would like to register, you can do so by calling the Parish House at 908-647-0118 or by visiting our website at stvincentschurch.org. Parishes require certificates of sponsorship for Godparents and Confirmation Sponsors. These will be issued only to those who are confirmed Catholics, registered in our parish, regular participants at Mass, and are validly married in the Church (if applicable). It is difficult to have to refuse anyone but it has had to be done at times (and never easy to do or accept). You should be registered with the Parish at least 6 months before we can give you a certificate to become a sponsor. We look forward to meeting you!

**READINGS FOR NEXT SUNDAY**

**First Reading: Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4** The prophet Habakkuk cries out despairingly to God because of the state Jerusalem has fallen into. He asks why God does nothing to stop the violence and misery. God assures him that a time will come when only the just and faithful will live.

**Second Reading: 2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14** Paul writes to Timothy from prison and urges him to continue to spread the gospel without fear or shame. He also tells Timothy to draw upon the strength of the Holy Spirit to help him face the hardships he will encounter while preaching.

**Gospel: Luke 17:5-10** The disciples ask Jesus to increase their faith. Jesus replies that "faith the size of a mustard seed could transplant a sycamore," indicating that a person either has faith, strong and complete, or none at all. Jesus also explains that a servant will not receive gratitude for simply following his master's orders. In the same way, we are all God's servants doing no more than our duty when we obey God's commands.

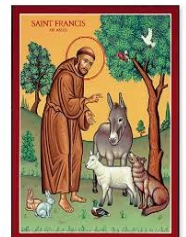


**CATHOLIC PERSPECTIVE ON END OF LIFE ISSUES**

**PARISH FOOD PANTRY NEEDS**

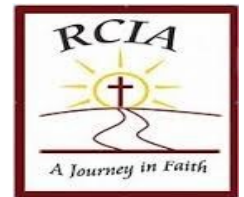
