

## From the Pastor's Desk

### Who Needs New Year's Resolutions?

The most frequent greeting to each other as we begin a new year is "Happy New Year." No one wants it for us more than God. God made us to be happy—today and every day and forever. That's why I've always liked an alternative greeting for this time of year — "Have a Blessed New Year."

The thing about a Blessed New Year is that it's guaranteed. God is blessing us pure and simple. God looks at us and loves us, and nothing we can do will ever change that. The only thing at issue is whether we accept the blessings from God. Sounds simple, doesn't' it? But accepting God's blessings means accepting God and what God stands for. It means making room in my life for God and for the things of God: justice, mercy, forgiveness, patience, charity and the like.

## Spiritual Adoption—Month 2

Our spiritually adopted babies' facial features, elbows, knees, fingers and toes have begun to develop. The first bone cells have appeared. The babies have all major body organs and systems, though they are not completely developed. Our babies' brains function at 40 days. Their heartbeats can now be heard on an ultrasonic stethoscope. At the end of this month, the babies respond to touch and grasp instruments placed in their hands. They are approximately 1-1/8" long.
