# From the Pastor's Desk

## The Year of Mercy and the Holy Doors

As we have been hearing, Pope Francis has proclaimed a Jubilee Year of Mercy throughout the Catholic Church. It started on December 8, 2015 and will conclude on November 20, 2016, the Feast of Christ the King.

One of the traditions associated with Jubilee Years is the tradition of the "Holy Door." In keeping with this, Pope Francis has asked that "a Holy Door be opened in every local church," at the Cathedral and at other churches of "special significance" designated by the Diocesan Bishop for the duration of the Jubilee Year. In the words of the Pope, these are to be "doors of Mercy, through which anyone who enters will experience the love of God, Who consoles, pardons and instills hope."

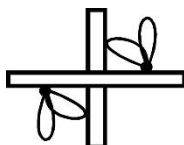
The Holy Father wishes all the faithful to experience the grace of the Jubilee by receiving the Jubilee Indulgence. To receive this indulgence, people are asked to make a brief pilgrimage to the Holy Door, open in every Cathedral or in shrines and designated churches as a sign of their desire for true conversion. Cardinal Dolan has designated the following places in the Archdiocese where the faithful may pass through the Holy Door of Mercy:

- St. Patrick's Cathedral
- The Basilica of St. Patrick's Old Cathedral, NYC
- St. Francis Cabrini Shrine, NYC
- National Shrine of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, Middletown
- National Shrine of Mary, Help of Christians, Stony Point

All those who enter a Door of Mercy with the proper intention and disposition, and fulfill the conditions ordinarily attached to a plenary indulgence, can obtain a Jubilee indulgence once daily for either themselves or for the souls of the faithful departed. Cardinal Dolan lists the following as conditions ordinarily attached to a plenary indulgence. Those who have the intention of gaining the indulgence must:

- Go to Confession (Sacrament of Reconciliation) within twenty days after performing the indulgenced work (pilgrimage to the *Door of Mercy*)
- Receive the Holy Eucharist within twenty days after performing the indulgenced work
- Pray for the intentions of the Holy Father within twenty days after performing the indulgenced work

What a wonderful thing to do when you next visit St. Patrick's Cathedral. I know many of you work in the area of the Cathedral. This is especially a grand opportunity for you. It's a holy deed for a Holy Year. Open wide the doors for Christ.



"As we begin this extraordinary Jubilee Year of God's Mercy, let us live out in our daily lives the mercy that the Father constantly extends to all of us. Let us allow God to surprise us. God never tires of throwing open the doors of his heart and repeats that he loves us and wants to share his love with us. The church feels the urgent need to proclaim God's mercy. Her life is authentic and credible only when she becomes a convincing herald of mercy. In this Jubilee Year, may the Church echo the word of God that resound strong and clear as a message and a sign of pardon, strength, aid and love. May we never tire of extending mercy, and be ever patient in offering compassion and comfort."
