From the Pastor's Desk

First, I would like to thank the people who chose to take part in the Parish Pilgrimage to Saint Patrick's Cathedral and walk through the Holy Door as designated by His Eminence, Timothy Michael Cardinal Dolan. God provided us with perfect weather; the Cathedral Renovations were spectacular, The Harbor Lights Sail on the Circle Line was totally enjoyable. But the free-flowing conversations and overall friendliness of everyone involved was for me the most enjoyable.

Before I was told that I was being assigned to St. Patrick's, Bedford, I had made plans to spend just under two weeks in Northern Italy. We fly into Venice with two nights just off of St. Mark's; than two nights in the Veneto (Mira). Verona and Norcia follow with two each. (Norcia is the birthplace of St. Benedict [July 11] and his twin sister St. Scholastica [Feb. 10]). They recently had an earthquake there this past August. And finally giving veracity to the old saying (all roads lead to Rome) we will spend three full days in Roma. I have been blessed with many trips to Rome, including my sabbatical that lasted 31/2 months, so I don't expect to see something new but I do expect to eat my way through the entire city, at some known and some still unknown restaurants or trattorias.

Normally, The Archdiocese of New York offers a weeklong workshop on how to be a better Pastor. For the last few years it has been offered during the last week of October. But this year it was moved up one week. Therefore, I return from Italy on Sunday the 16th but on Monday the 17th I drive out to Spring Lake where the workshops are 'iffy' but being with 100 other Pastors is invaluable.

So, please pray for me, I promise to pray for you at all the shrines and holy places. And please be extra kind to Fr. Joseph, he will be here the whole time I am away.


