# From The Pastor's Desk

Listening Sessions: Last week the Pastoral Council met and discussed how best to deal with all of the input that we received from you; either by vocal participation in one of the three listening sessions held in the Church, by your written responses to the forms found in the Church, or by remarks made online. It was decided to form some working committees to deal with primary categories of the topics presented. These committees are to meet and form a list of priorities that will then be presented to the whole council and finally to me as the Pastor. Our hope is that when people return from the summer vacations, we will be ready to present you the issues that were raised and our purposed responses.

Real or True Presence:

Following on last week's topic, I would like to mention some thoughts on Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharist Outside of Mass.

"The sacrament of the eucharist was entrusted by Christ to his bride, the Church, as spiritual nourishment and as a pledge of eternal life. The Church continues to receive this gift with faith and love". The celebration of the eucharist in the sacrifice of the Mass is the true origin and purpose of the worship shown to the eucharist outside Mass. The principal reason for reserving the sacrament after Mass is to unite, through sacramental communion, the faithful unable to participate in the Mass, especially the sick and aged, with Christ and the offering of his sacrifice.

In turn, Eucharistic reservation of communion, led to the practice of adoring this sacrament and offering to it the worship which is due to God. This cult of adoration is based upon valid and solid principles. Moreover, some of the public and communal forms of this worship were instituted by the Church itself.

The rite of Mass, of course was revised after Vatican Council II, and the instruction Eucharisticum mysterium of May 25, 1967, regulations had been published on the practical arrangements for the cult of this sacrament even after Mass and its relationship to the proper ordering of the sacrifice of the Mass in the light of that Council, and of other documents of the Apostolic See on this matter. In 1973, the Congregation for Divine Worship has revised the rites, Holy Communion Outside Mass.

The Contents page of this revised ritual includes such topics as Holy Communion Outside Mass: Administration of Communion and Viaticum to the Sick by an Extraordinary Minister. It also covers such includes the Rite of Exposition and Benediction, Eucharistic Processions, and even Eucharistic Congresses. In a separate ritual, the Church has even published an "Oder for the Solemn Exposition of the Holy Eucharist that covers how parishes should organize '40 Hour Devotions'. Each of these will be covered in this column during the summer weeks. I can think of nothing more important that increasing our love and devotion to the Lord Jesus, truly present in the Eucharist-body and blood, soul and divinity.

Their hearts began to beat on Day 21 and are pumping bloodwhich can be a different type than the mother's—through their own circulatory systems.
