

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

Passiontide:

From the Fifth Sunday of Lent until just before the beginning of the celebration of the Lord's supper is known as Passiontide. While all of Lent is lowkey, the liturgies during Passiontide are more somber. The ascetical practices of prayer, fasting, abstinence, penance, and charity become more pronounced. This deeper time of reflection and preparing for the celebrations of the Sacred Triduum is aided by changes in church décor as well as liturgical prayer.

Some of the changes in church décor include a much bearer Altar, less cluttered Sanctuary, and no holy water. In the diocese of the United States, the practice of covering crosses and images throughout the Church from the Fifth Sunday of Lent may be observed. Crosses remain covered until the end of the celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, but the images remain covered until the beginning of the Easter Vigil.

Holy Week:

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord.

All the Masses on Palm Sunday will include the distribution and Blessing of Palm, as well as the proclamation of the Passion According to Mark.

Reconciliation Monday.

Every Catholic Church from Montauk, Long Island to Tivoli on the Eastern shore of the Hudson River or Phoenicia on the Western side of the Hudson will have a priest available in the Church to hear confessions from 3:00pm until 9:00pm.

Tuesday of Holy Week.

The Chrism Mass will be celebrated in St. Patrick's Cathedral, 5th Avenue, Manhattan, at 4:00pm. Every priest is encouraged to participate because they renew their priestly vows as well as the Cardinal Archbishop blessing the three oils used in every church through the coming year.

Next week will include a description of the Sacred Triduum.

Hope that yesterday's celebration of our Patron, Saint Patrick was joyous and that tomorrow's Feast of Saint Joseph, Patron of the Universal Church will be blessed.
