FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

We are familiar with the, "I am" sayings of Jesus. He identified Himself in many ways as the Good Shepherd, the true vine, the way, the truth and the life etc. As we continue to read The Bread of Life Discourse in our Gospel this week, Jesus identifies Himself as the "bread that came down from heaven" and the "Bread of Life." This bread is not a food that perishes but feeds us and nourishes us for the journey of life and faith. As God told Elijah in the first reading, without eating "the journey will be too long for you." Elijah eats and is able to continue on. Without the Eucharist we would lack the strength and courage we need to be faithful followers of Christ. The journey of life would be impossible without the Bread of Life. May we grow in our reverence for the Eucharist and in our appreciation of such a great gift.

This week we also celebrate the Assumption of Mary into heaven, a Holy day of Obligation. This feast celebrates the natural conclusion of the dogma of the Immaculate Conception which declared that Mary was sinless from the first moment of her conception. At the end of her earthly Mary was preserved from the corruption of death and assumed body and soul into heaven. She is the first to share in the fullness of the redemption accomplished by her Son. May Mary intercede for us so that like her we may be faithful in living out God's will in our lives in responding to our call to holiness as we pray:

all creation rightly gives you praise
for all life and all holiness come from you.
In the plan of Your wisdom
she who bore the Christ in her womb
