Words of Inspiration:

Overlooking the Lord

Epiphany comes from the Greek term for *manifest* or *reveal*. The Magi found the Lord by looking up, but afterwards they had to look down at a helpless infant. During a childhood game of *hide and seek*, I sat on the ground in our neighbors' yard. I was right in front of my brother when he walked up to the fence, but he "overlooked" me, gazing over my head. Historical seekers overlooked the Lord, eyeing royalty over peasantry and might over weakness. We too sometimes overlook Christ in our families, friends and neighbors who are sitting right in front of us. We think of an epiphany as the discovery of something obscure or hidden, but Jesus is born in full view of anyone who knows where to look.
