FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

Many people mistakenly think that the Christmas Season ended with the Feast of the Epiphany which we celebrated last Sunday. However, the Christmas Season comes to an end with this Sunday's celebration of the Baptism of the Lord. This feast celebrates Jesus' desire to identify with our humanity and He gives us a reminder of our own Baptism. Of course, Jesus did not need to be baptized as we did. He had no Original Sin to be taken away nor did He need to be welcomed into the family of God as He was God. He did not need to receive the call to holiness as we did as He always shared in the life of God in His divinity. Jesus was not baptized to be made holy. He was baptized to make the waters of Baptism holy for us.

As we recall the Baptism of the Lord let us each be renewed in our own Baptismal commitment and strive to achieve holiness in our lives as we follow the example Jesus has given us. On Monday we return to "Ordinary Time." We know that no time in our worship of God nor in our relationship with Him is ever "Ordinary." Ordinary Time refers to those weeks of the Liturgical Year when we are not celebrating the special seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter. The Sundays of the year are designated with the ordinal numbers (e.g. first, second, etc.)

As we conclude the Christmas Season may each of you continue to be renewed by Christ's presence in our lives and never let our spiritual lives ever be ordinary.



Spiritual Adoption Program
Month 1**

Our spiritually adopted babies have been quite active over the past month and are already 10,000 times bigger than at conception. They are about ½" long, weigh less than 1 oz and by day 10 have developed the foundations of their brains, spinal cords and nervous systems. Simple kidneys, liver and digestive tract are taking shape. Their hearts began to beat on Day 21 and are pumping blood—which can be a different type than the mother's—through their own circulatory systems.
