This week's reading from St. Paul speaks to us of the Mystical Body of Christ. Each of us is blessed with unique gifts in different measures. Thus, everything Luke does to make his story coherent and realistic is done to convince all his readers beginning with Theophilus that his ordered narrative presents a trustworthy guide to the understanding of the real Jesus. Just as it takes real people to shape Jesus' message, so it takes a realistic or connected narrative ("an orderly sequence") to make his message available to those who come along after the eyewitnesses with a need and a desire to see for themselves who this Jesus was.

The Community Center of Northern Westchester gave out 398,796 lbs. of food to over 2000 families in 2018, including 119,000 lbs. of fresh fruits and vegetables. 37% of those who received food are children. The Center supports a wide variety of Neighbors in need, including families with infants and toddlers, the elderly and disabled, and adults and families that need a helping hand. In addition to food, the Center also offers a wide range of programs that help people become self-sufficient: classes that enhance entrepreneurial skills, certification courses, scholarships, career planning, and much more.

Paper grocery bags with a suggested shopping list will be distributed from January 22nd through January 27th, at CCD classes on Tuesday and Sunday; at CYO practices/games and at Masses on the 26th and 27th.

**Your food donations should be returned between  
January 29th and February 3rd, as follows:**

- **CCD bags can be dropped off at CCD classes on Tuesday or Sunday.**
- **CYO bags can be dropped off at CYO practices/games at the school**
- **Parishioners may return their bags to Church until Sunday, February 3rd.**
