FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

Having heard the Beatitudes in last Sunday's Gospel, Jesus continues the sermon to His audience with guidelines for their lives as disciples. The message they hear is perhaps the most challenging message we hear as well. It is also the most difficult to put into practice. Jesus speaks about loving our enemies, turning the other cheek and giving to others without looking for repayment. The most difficult words perhaps are those about judging others and forgiveness. We live in a world where retaliation is common. The need for revenge is sadly an all too human weakness. We hear "I don't get mad, I get even" often said by those who have been hurt.

The Lord is telling us that we are not called to continue the cycle of anger but often to walk away from it. If we expect forgiveness from God then we have to be willing to forgive those who have hurt us. While we can judge the objective evil that others seem to commit, we can never judge what is in a person's heart. We must leave that judgement up to God. The only person we can truly and honestly judge is ourselves. We pray for the grace to accept the message the Lord imparts to us today so we can truly be His disciples.

The Test for Peacemakers

Peacemakers themselves can become the victims of the evil forces they are trying to overcome. The tragedy is that peacemakers often reveal more of the demons they are fighting than of the peace they want to bring about. The words of Jesus go right to the heart of our struggle: "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who treat you badly" (Lk 6:27-28). The more I reflect on these words, the more I consider them to be the test for peacemakers. What my enemies deserve is not my anger, rejection, resentment, or disdain, but my love. Spiritual guides throughout history have said that love for the enemy is the cornerstone of the message of Jesus and the core of holiness.
