## HOW TO REPORT ALLEGATIONS OF SEXUAL ABUSE

### REPORT IMMEDIATELY!

**REMEMBER: YOUR ROLE IS TO REPORT. THERE IS TO BE NO INVESTIGATION BY YOU OR ANYONE ELSE AT THE PARISH/SCHOOL LEVEL**

**If you suspect abuse has occurred within a family:**

Contact the Department of Social Services within the county the abuse took place. Contact the Diocese, to report status at (843) 261-0430.

**If you suspect an abuse has occurred that involved diocesan personnel (priests, deacons, teachers, employees or volunteers) contact:**

The local police department immediately.

Dear Parishioners,

Today we hear Jesus caution us: “whoever does not receive the kingdom of God like a child shall not enter it.” In what way must we be “like a child” to receive the kingdom?

Generally, children are not envious — they are grateful for what they receive, and do not concern themselves with what others have. Generally — some small children want the toy another is using, and are not content with one just as good. Little children are not afraid to ask for help, and ask without doubt that their request will be granted. Think of a child who asks with the command “Tie my shoes.”? Little children do not seek positions of power. Little children are glad to be of service. They want to help, and are content if they can give only a little help. Little children love, respect, and obey their parents. Little children delight when they please their parents.

Little children may ask “Why?” desiring to understand, and they will not try to trip you up with a question as the Pharisees asked Jesus today. Just as the Pharisees questioned Jesus’ teachings about marriage, we still find people who express disagreement with a statement that ends with a question mark. Why can’t divorced people remarry without an annulment? Why do I need to get married in the Church? Why can I not receive communion when I did not get married in the Church? When people ask these questions the way the Pharisees questioned Jesus, they will not approach the kingdom of heaven. When we ask with a willingness to please God the Father, and to imitate Jesus in doing whatever it takes to please God the Father — then the kingdom of heaven is ours.
