Dear Parishioners,

The New Testament's "Letter to the Hebrews" was written, no big surprise, to Hebrews. Crucial to understanding this letter is an awareness of knowledge common to Hebrews. The role of the "High Priest" is particularly important, since Jesus became the new High Priest. Since the days of Moses, the High Priest alone would go into the presence of the Ark of the Covenant kept in the "Holy of Holies". The temple was meant to be a reminder of heaven, and the Holy of Holies was the place where God dwelled with His people. Every priest would accept offerings to sacrifice for the atonement of sins committed by individuals. For all the sins of everyone in the nation, however, the high priest would sacrifice on the "Day of Atonement". On this one day a year the high priest entered into the Holy of Holies, and only on this day did he speak God's Holy Name, asking God to remove the punishment for the people's sins.

Now read the second reading for today — Hebrews 9:24-28. Jesus is not in the temple in Jerusalem — made at Solomon's command, but is in heaven. Jesus is before God the Father on our behalf, interceding for us eternally. Jesus does not offer the blood of an animal, but offers His own body and blood eternally. Jesus was born once, and died once, but His sacrifice and prayers are nonetheless eternal!
