the sacramental life

Baptism

To have a child baptized, you must register and attend a class as a couple (unless attendance just isn't possible, in which case some discussion with Kathy Kehnast will be necessary). Sessions are held quarterly for both parishes. The next session will be Wednesday, Feb 22. Take the class before your child is born. If you are expecting, call Kathy to register for the class. Please don't ask if you "have to go." This is an opportunity to meet with parents of children about the same age as your little one; they are in the same wonderful boat as you are.

At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic. **Both godparents need to be practicing Christians, at least one a practicing Catholic.** If you don't attend Sunday Mass regularly, there is something you can do about it: Start coming to Sunday Mass. If you can't come (health, severe weather, employment requirements, etc.), speak to your confessor. He will help you.

Penance

The priest is available for Penance

- at St Bernadette Saturdays at 3 PM and Thursdays at 5:30 PM, and
- at St Mary Bremen on Sunday at 8 AM.

In addition to Advent and Lenten Penance Services, every Catholic priest is available whenever there is a need. There are Penance opportunities for parochial school children **four times during the year so that they will**

Anointing of the Sick

The Sick receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick **when dangerously ill, facing major surgery, or suffering from the ravages of old age.** We celebrate the sacrament communally at a Sunday Mass before Advent and during the Easter season so that we can all pray with you for "health of mind and body."

And, we are happy to bring Penance, Anointing, and Holy Communion to the homes or hospitals of the sick or shut in. It is very helpful to **call the parish office to let us know before a hospitalization or when it has been too long** since the sacraments were last available.

Holy Matrimony

Couples wishing to marry sacramentally should contact the parish office six months before they wish to celebrate the sacrament. Why so long? Because **this sacrament, not just the ceremony, requires serious preparation.** And the Church needs to be involved in that preparation. She tries to support couples through the years of their married life. For this reason, our diocese offers programs to enhance married life. To learn how, watch the weekly bulletin.

What Else the Magi Have to Teach Us when astrology and historical determinism came to an end

The Church's Christmas and New Year gift to us is a profusion of great feasts that have a lot of joy and a lot of depth for all of us. Today, in addition to being the Twelfth Day of Christmas (when my true love gave to me ... a lot of stuff), is, of course, the feast of the Epiphany. It is the day that celebrates the showing of the little Lord Jesus to the world in the persons of the Magi. They weren't originally kings (that is a delightful little embellishment). And they weren't so much wise men as star gazers. In pre-modern times there was only a murky distinction between astronomers (scientists) and astrologers (now discredited as superstitious because of their belief that the stars influence human affairs). The Magi were apparently some rather exotic Persian astrologers who followed the star to see the new born king of the Jews. And they wanted to pay tribute to him. This feast of the manifestation of Jesus to the nations is one of the great holy days. It is about **the beginning of the sharing of the revelation of God's love, first given to the Jews, to all of humanity.**

Last Monday, on January 2, there was a lower caliber holy day, but still a very fine one. The Church celebrated the feast of **Saint Gregory of Nazianzen** and his great friend and colleague **St Basil of Caesarea**. These were fourth century seekers after wisdom, who dropped everything so that they could follow the way of the Lord Jesus more intensely. Instead they had **the misfortune to be made bishops**. Well, Gregory saw it as a misfortune; Basil took to it like a duck to water. Gregory eventually became bishop of Constantinople, the center of the Eastern Roman Empire. But he didn't let being a great man of affairs get in the way of insightful and very poetic reflections on the mysteries of the Faith. For this he has long been known as one of the four great doctors of the Eastern Church.

In his second encyclical letter, *Spe salvi* (On Human Hope), Pope Benedict XVI offered a reflection on the meaning of the Epiphany unlike most reflections on the Epiphany. He cited Saint Gregory in his discussion of the barrenness of the ancient pagan religions. Benedict wrote:

Saint Gregory Nazianzen is enlightening. He says that at the very moment when the Magi, guided by the star, adored Christ the new king, **astrology came to an end**, because the stars were now moving in the orbit determined by Christ.

But Pope Benedict is not the man to leave things there.

This scene, in fact, overturns **the world-view of that time ... [which] in a different way has become fashionable once again today. It is not the elemental spirits of the universe, the laws of matter, which ultimately govern the world and mankind, but a personal God governs the stars, that is, the universe; it is not the laws of matter and of evolution that have the final say, but reason, will, love—a Person.** And if we know this Person and he knows us, then truly the inexorable power of material elements no longer has the last word; **we are not slaves of the universe and of its laws, we are free.** In ancient times, honest enquiring minds were aware of this. Heaven is not empty. Life is not a simple product of laws and the randomness of matter, but **within everything and at the same time above everything, there is a personal will, there is a Spirit who in Jesus has revealed himself as Love.**

The Pope sees in the insight of the Doctor about the end of the ancient but empty picture of man being controlled by the forces of the stars a remarkable hint about the way **modern people sometimes see man as the pawn of other kinds of forces, whether the forces of history (Marxism) or of a destiny of natural selection and the survival of the fittest (Darwinism) or of the determinism of behavior under the control of genetic predispositions or the influence of upbringing.** In these perspectives, the word "inexorable" dominates. People talk as though we were, when they use the expression "being on the right side (or the wrong side) of history." But even the things that seem most likely to happen are not inevitable. We must still strive for the right.

The influences of our past, our communal or our own personal, individual past, certainly can have their effect, but they are not the whole story. And **our lives are not governed by forces that are above God.** History is not above God. And our own lives aren't governed by our genes or governed by our "conditions."

God made us with a free will. And even if there are complicating influences—which there very often are—with a very strong tug on us, **we can still choose to do the right thing.** These influences may make it more difficult, and we may fall, but we don't stop being able to do the right thing. God will keep forgiving us and giving us the grace to come back to him. Perhaps after many, many falls. But we will only cripple ourselves morally if we insist that we have no choice but to sin. That is not how God made us.

We need to relearn **the lesson of the Epiphany, a lesson about a personal God—who loves us—and who has made us free,** even if our freedom is sometimes impaired. We are not slaves. We are free. And the God who governs the stars has revealed himself as love.

Today we should learn from and be grateful for the insights of Saint Gregory and Pope Benedict. But mostly we **should rejoice in the freedom that comes from the revelation of Jesus.** Happy Epiphany!
