Sacramental Life

Baptism

To have a child baptized, parents must register and attend a class as a couple. Try to attend before your child is born. At least one parent and godparent must be practicing Catholics. Please call or email the church office for information or to register.

Confession

The priest is available for Penance at St. Bernadette on Saturday at 3 PM and Thursday at 5:30 PM, and at St. Mary Bremen on Sunday at 8 AM. Saturday Confessions are held at 8:30 AM at St. Bernadette. Every Catholic priest is available whenever there is a need.

Anointing and Care of the Sick

The priest gives the Anointing of the Sick to one who is dangerously ill, facing major surgery, or suffering from the ravages of old age. Call the parish office before a hospitalization or when it has been too long since the Sacraments were last available.

Holy Matrimony

Couples wishing to marry should contact the parish office six months before a wedding. Why so long? Because this Sacrament, not just the ceremony, requires serious preparation. And the Church needs to be involved in that preparation. The Church needs to support couples through the years of married life and offers programs to enhance married life. To learn about these programs, watch the bulletin.

Eucharistic Adoration

Eucharistic Adoration takes place each Wednesday at St. Bernadette with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at 9 AM and Benediction and Reposition at 1 PM. All are welcome and encouraged to come.

Collar Corner

Lent is upon us! Ash Wednesday is a graced day for everyone, but especially for those who have fallen away from the Faith. Make it a point to invite someone to Mass with you. Anyone can receive ashes, Catholic or not.

Remember the laws of fasting and abstinence. Specific details and general programming opportunities for Lent are outlined below.

Make your Lent plan now, and write it down: give something up, do something extra, and pray somehow better. Those are the hallmarks of Lent: fasting, almsgiving, and prayer.

Both parishes will have Stations of the Cross Fridays at 7 PM along with a brief time of Eucharistic Adoration and Benediction after.

St. Bernadette will show the *Pivotal Players* video series in the Mary Good Center Sundays at 9:30 AM and host Evening Prayer at 5 PM.

St. Mary will have a parish retreat day for Lent on April 7th. We will have Adoration throughout the day, Confessions at 3 PM, and a sermon with Benediction from 5-6 PM.

St. Bernadette will offer 40 Hours Devotion as our parish spiritual mission from April 5th–7th. Sermons will be Friday night at Stations and at the Saturday morning Latin Mass and the Masses of the 5th Sunday of Lent, ending with Solemn Benediction Sunday at 11 AM.

Last Saturday we had the first meeting of the St. Bernadette Pro-Life club. They agreed to coordinate our Bottoms Up diaper drive as a Lenten charity project. Please be generous! They also plan to offer the first Sunday of the month 10:30 AM Rosary to the Pro-Life cause. The next meeting is scheduled for Saturday March 23rd after the morning Mass. Come!

Our RCIA Catechumens and Candidates will attend the Rite of Election next Sunday. Please pray for them as they begin their final preparations to receive the Sacraments.

The Holy Season of Lent

Fast and Abstinence

During Lent, Catholics in the United States

- abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent.
Catholics 14 and older are bound by the law of abstinence;
- fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. That means we eat only one full meal on those days; one or two smaller meals may be taken those days, but may not total one full meal. And no eating between meals.
All adults are bound by the law of fast until they are 59.

Pastors and parents are to see to it that minors who are not bound by the law of fast and abstinence are educated in an authentic sense of penance.

Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday is March 6. Ashes will be imposed at:

- St Bernadette at 8:20 AM and at 6 PM Masses and
- St Mary at NOON Mass.

Solemn exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at St. Bernadette will occur after morning Mass as usual.

On Ash Wednesday the Church Prays

Grant, O Lord, that we may begin with holy fasting this campaign of Christian service, so that, as we take up battle against spiritual evils, we may be armed with weapons of self-restraint. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

Rice Bowl

This year's theme for Catholic Relief Services' Operation Rice Bowl is "Encounter Lent." This Lent, we answer the call to serve the "least of our brothers and sisters" through Rice Bowl. A complete list of all the Deanery Penance Services will be published soon.

Bottoms Up Diaper Drive

During Lent, our parishes will help Bottoms Up to provide diapers for the Bishop Griffin Resource Center, St. Stephen's Community House Day Care, and St. Mark Food Pantry. The need at this time is for sizes 5 and 6. You can bring your donations to the table in the school hallway at St. Bernadette or the parish hall in Bremen. Statistics show that 1 in 3 U.S. families struggle to buy diapers for their children at a cost of \$70 - \$80 per month, with the average baby needing 6-10 diapers a day.
