A good word from Fr. Jim,

A note and explanation concerning the new Mass times listed above. Fr. Rausch will be in the hospital for the next month or so and what his recovery will be like is at this time uncertain. Given this unfortunate turn, it seems like revising our mass times is the right thing to do. I've come up with a temporary schedule that keeps a weekend Mass in each parish and tries to deviate as little as possible from where and when our masses are now. Note that everyone is making a bit of a sacrifice: Immaculate Conception, Sumner keeps their Saturday Mass but loses Sunday morning; the folks at St. Peter, Clermont have to get up a half hour earlier to make it; Holy Name, West Union loses its Saturday Mass and celebrates on Sunday a half hour earlier than now; and parishioners of St. Francis of Assisi, Fayette will have to delay their lunch by a half hour. I'm interested in your feedback on this new schedule, so be sure to let me know what you think. It's temporary for now but if it works well I'd like to make it permanent. After we try it for a month or so we will evaluate how things are going and proceed from there.

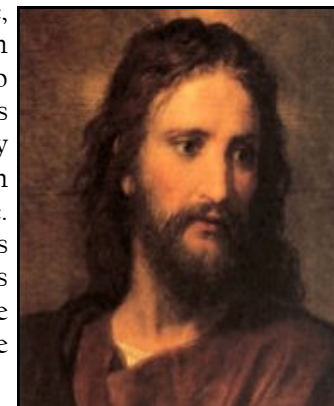
