"Through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault."

We acknowledge our sins by not only being penitent but also humbly confessing to Almighty God. The current translation is just faithfully rendering what's always been there in the original Latin which is "**mea culpa, mea culpa, mea maxima culpa.**" Hence the new translation restores the literal language of the Roman Missal, using the phrase, "through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault."

The richness of that repetition reflects the reality of sin in a particularly meaningful way. It also manifests our humility before Almighty God. In the journey to holiness humility is essential. "We are beggars before God," and "We are not His equals. He's not our buddy. He is our Creator, and as His creatures we owe Him adoration. We haven't come to Mass to give orders, but to receive orders. So at the beginning of Eucharistic celebration we implore God's mercy, forgiveness and love because we are not worthy to stand before His presence. "When we sin, by definition, we turn as an act of the will *against the Lord* by asserting our own disordered desires over and against the will of Him who we will proclaim later in the Mass to be *Holy, Holy, Holy*. Therefore, when we acknowledge our sin against the Thrice Holy God, it is fitting that we should say, "**Through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault.**"

In summary, we are essentially saying in the *Confiteor* (*I confess*), that "I know that I have sinned – *greatly* – against the Thrice Holy God – **therefore** I seek forgiveness, and I do so by turning not just to God alone, but to all who have been wounded by my actions. I know that my sins not only affect my relationship with the Lord, but also with every member of His Body. **Therefore** I turn to ask the intercession of His Most Holy Mother-Blessed Virgin Mary. I likewise turn to those beyond this world – the angels and saints. And finally I turn also to my brothers and sisters, asking prayers of forgiveness of all concerned."
