The cost of discipleship

Hate your family, carry a cross, and give up everything else in life—that is the cost of following Jesus? Politicians always want the most supporters and votes possible, and will say, promise or do almost anything to increase the number of people who will eventually vote for them. This doesn't mean they will keep the promises they made. All they wanted is to get elected and be in charge. Sometimes they care less about the people who elected them to office. Jesus isn't a politician at all. He doesn't need any campaign or votes. However, He gives the requirement to be taken seriously by those who want to follow Him.

He was going to Jerusalem to die, although he seemed to be the only one aware of that fact. So when Jesus saw the crowds rushing toward him, coming along side to journey with him to Jerusalem, he offered the words of our Gospel lesson for today. He didn't mince words but gave full disclosure of the cost of discipleship. There are three jarring parallel statements contained in these few sentences, "If anyone comes to me, and does not hate his father and mother, his wife and children, his brothers and sisters—yes even his own life, he cannot be my disciple. . . . Anyone who does not carry his own cross and follow me cannot be my disciple. . . . Any of you who does not give up everything he has cannot be my disciple."

Who would be willing to sign up for such a journey? And what does he really mean? He doesn't mean literally hating your family. So it isn't a matter of feelings of affection, but "it's a matter of not letting anyone or anything be valued or become more important than your commitment to Jesus. Besides He endorses self denial and never asked everyone He knew to give up their possession. Probably some of His followers must have been well off. He is telling all of us that if our possessions prevent us from being able to make out time and serve God, then we must renounce our possessions and say goodbye to them.
