## Turning the other cheek!

This is a phrase in Christian doctrine that refers to “refraining from retaliation when one has been attacked, or insulted.” To “turn the other cheek,” does not imply pacifism, nor does it mean we place ourselves or others in mortal danger.

As Jesus continued his sermon on the mount, He urges His followers never to give in to retaliation or revenge: **“You have heard it said, ‘An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.’ But I say to you, do not resist an evildoer. But if anyone strikes you on the right cheek, turn the other also.”** Our Lord continued, “If anyone forces you to go one mile, go also the second mile. Give to everyone who begs from you and do not refuse anyone who wants to borrow from you.” These are very tough words to hear and practice nowadays. Some of us, of course, would question we presently live in a world broken by the “eye for an eye, tooth for a tooth” behavior. A country is bombed, the bombed bomb back. Someone takes advantage of me, I then find a way to get even or lawsuits...and on it goes . . . forever. Is it right?

Obviously Jesus is aware this is a difficult way to live, regardless, He is admonishing His disciples the importance of good deeds even to loving enemies, praying for those who persecute them as well going the extra mile, doing good for others. This explains the power of forgiveness which can only transform bitterness and anger into healing and peace. “To err is human; to forgive, divine and this readiness to forgive is the unique attribute of our God. Christ Himself remained silent to His false accusers and even more so prayed on the cross for His executioners: “Father forgive them, because they know not what they do.”

Both today’s first reading and gospel teaches us not to take revenge, no insult, no hatred, no vindictiveness or grudge towards others. When others expect the worst from you, overwhelm them with kindness, compassion, forgiveness, acceptance, and ultimately love.
