The Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time October 18, 2015

Then, of course, I was appointed here in 2003 to a parish comprised mostly of Italians. I was thrilled to welcome the Italian Police and friends back to East Hanover for the Morris County Columbus Day Dinner Dance celebrated last Friday evening at the Hanover Manor. It was an honor to meet Michael Castaldo and others who were honored during the evening.

What a pleasure to have Fr. Luigi, pastor of St. Lucy's in Newark concelebrate with us last Sunday. We were thrilled to have their beautiful Statue of St. Gerard present in the church for prayers, thanksgiving and petitions. It's always wonderful to meet and greet the Italian Police and it was a particular joy to have them come to St. Rose for the 10:30am Mass.

As you are aware, the car raffle is our biggest parish fundraiser. This year we have budgeted to make \$60,000.00. It's always a little scary when the ticket sales are slow. This year it is definitely slow. To date we have brought in \$43,390.00 so at least now the cost of the car is paid so our profit to date is \$9,985.00. We only have one week to go but in times of anxiety I ask God to take over and that is what I am doing now. Thanks to every registered parishioner who has brought back their tickets and to non-registered who have bought tickets. I'm very grateful to the many ticket sellers who sell in the booth and who bring the tickets to work and to family members, thus increasing our sales. Can everyone please give one last push so that we can meet our budgetary goals?

This weekend I have asked all members of Parish Council to cover all Masses and sell tickets to the Sliced Steak Dinner this coming Saturday, October 24th. The tickets are \$45.00 each. It seems expensive but the quality of the food is excellent!!! It's always a fun night and of course the most exciting part is when we pick the winner of the car. I've heard great reports on the car this year. Pity I can't win!!! Best of luck to all.

News From Rome

As you are reading this I have just finished two weeks of school. I would like to talk to you today about a wonderful country that I had the privilege to visit, Slovenia. This little country is located along the North-Eastern border of Italy and is full of culture as well as very genuine and friendly people. I went with Leo Song, a seminarian friend from the Diocese of Rockville Center whom I first met when I was in Washington, D.C., Fr. Kevin Kilgore, a newly ordained priest for the Archdiocese of Newark who is completing his post-ordination studies here in Rome, and Fr. Paddy O'Donovan, the new pastor at Notre Dame of Mt. Carmel in our own diocese. It was an incredible experience to travel with these three holy men and to get to know them better.

It was especially interesting to travel with Fr. Paddy since it was a coincidence! When my friend Leo first invited me on the trip he said a priest he knew from the states was coming along and I thought nothing of it. As the date approached, he let me know that he was actually a priest from our diocese, Fr. Paddy. I knew then there was no way the Irish priests from the Diocese of Paterson were ever going to let me out of their sight even in Rome! More so since Fr. Owen and Fr. Paddy are both from Limerick and Fr. Paddy is now in our deanery, a group of parishes whose pastors work together and help each other. It is always incredible to experience the people that God puts right in front of us and to see how we truly are all brothers and sisters in Christ.
