World Youth Day Reflection by Kathi Magnifico

Hello everyone. My name is Kathi Magnifico. I am one of the fortunate people of our parish to have had the opportunity to attend the World Youth Day festivities in *Kraków*, Poland this past summer. Just like all of you, I have returned to fall schedules of school, calendar of events, meetings, and the routine of everyday life that follows summer vacations. However, for me, one thing has changed drastically and pleasantly. Because of this World Youth Day pilgrimage I took with Father Owen and the people from our parish, I thankfully have the opportunity to reflect often -with a smile on my face - the most wonderful, spiritual experience of my life.

You may have heard other people speak about our journey, including my son Eric, whom I felt so blessed for that we shared this together. But we all have our own version of this miraculous pilgrimage. We witnessed first hand, the enormous power of uniting together in universal spirituality. We had a chance to see and hear our Pope Francis's message of Divine Mercy. I won't ever forget going to the park, along with one million other pilgrims, and feeling safe in the presence of God's love. I had always heard that praying together in a group is a powerful thing. Well, it was moving beyond words.

I still can remember clear as day, how nervous and fearful I was to be part of this. The media was discouraging, and it seemed impossible for us to feel safe. It was when I received a phone call from Father Owen, asking if I would still consider our plans, I knew it was the right thing to do. It was in that moment I faced the fear inside me, and embraced the same faith in God that Father Owen never doubted. We were meant to go.

The city of *Kraków* is remarkable, filled with more culture and stories of past history that I could possibly absorb in those few days. I looked at everything around me - the cobblestone streets, the cathedrals, and buildings built centuries ago. I tried to imagine what kind of lives the people had, that walked these streets before me. And I thought how fortunate it was, that this city was not bombed after the war like so many others. Instead, our group toured and embraced the sights before us, just like so many others that week, with our flag held high, greeting pilgrims from all over the world with love in our hearts. We were all there united for the very same purpose - to pray together and share the bond of our faith in God with courage.

The Polish people made us feel so welcome, with their kindness. They offered security with extra policemen and armies stationed everywhere. But more than that, the feeling in the air of happiness, hope, the love of God, and peace was everywhere we went. We did a lot of walking and exploring. One day, we also took a bus trip to the hometown of St. Pope John Paul II. We visited the basilica where he was baptized, and toured the home he grew up in. We also celebrated mass every day with Father Owen, Deacon Michal, and Alex in some of the most beautifully decorated churches I have ever seen. All these churches were magnificent, with statues and paintings dedicated to saints, the Blessed Mother and Jesus. You could tell from the hand crafted architecture that these churches were made with such reverence and love for God.

In closing, I want to thank everyone who prayed for our safety while we were gone, and for all your support. It was a pleasure to pray for all of you and your intentions in such beautiful surroundings. Thank you.

Baptism
