Lord, Enter Our Homes and Be Our Guest

We celebrate today another moment in the beautiful Christmas Season, as we contemplate the three Magi finding their way to the crib of Jesus.

In some cultures, this day, the Feast of the Epiphany (Manifestation) is more truly Christmas than December 25th. That is because on Christmas Day we celebrate that the Savior promised to all Israel has finally been born. Today, we celebrate that this Savior, Jesus, is meant for all the Gentile nations too. The three kings lead the way. The acceptance of these foreigners at the manger of Jesus means that this baby belongs to all of us non-Jews, also. He is meant to be 'Savior of the World.'

They were called 'Wise Men' because they sought out the Lord. May we follow their example and welcome the Lord into our lives. They were known as 'Magi,' because they studied the stars and all creation, and were led to the Creator. May we allow creation to speak to us of its Lord, too. They were thought of as 'Kings,' yet in humility they acknowledged the 'King of Kings.' May we have their humility also, in reverencing the Lord by manner of our lives.

Through long tradition, we know them as Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar. As the Magi enter the house of the infant Jesus, we ask that the same Jesus enter into our homes. May He always be welcome to stay with us, and have the first place as Guest in our homes.

The Feast of the Three Kings is traditionally a time to bless our homes and to ask the Lord to keep our families together in love and peace.

Take some time today to gather as a family to bless your home. With chalk, write over the doorway: "20 + C + M + B + 18." As you do so, have someone offer the following prayer:

Lord God of heaven and earth, You revealed Your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless our home, and all who live here. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for each other, and for all, may reflect Your own love. May the wisdom of the Magi be found in us, that we may always seek You. Amen.

Finding Hope In The New Year

Did you ever see the text abbreviation H.O.P.E.? It means "have only positive expectations" and is a quick way to give someone encouragement. Happiness ~ Jesus taught us the way to be truly happy is to live the beatitudes. For example, "Blessed are the peacemakers" (v.9), come to an agreement that you will avoid loud arguments by making time to talk about disagreements together.

The Epiphany of the Lord January 7, 2018

"You have heard of the stewardship of God's grace that was given to me for your benefit,...it was not made known to people in other generations as it now has been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit that the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel."

We hear the story of the visitors from the east, the magi, remember the three gifts and the guidance of the star. But St. Paul offers us something more for our consideration. God in His goodness has sent His Son, for the salvation of all people. Paul explained it clearly, as revealed now.

It remembers Jesus' baptism by John, signifying Him to be of the People of Israel, looking forward to the promises of Salvation by God.
