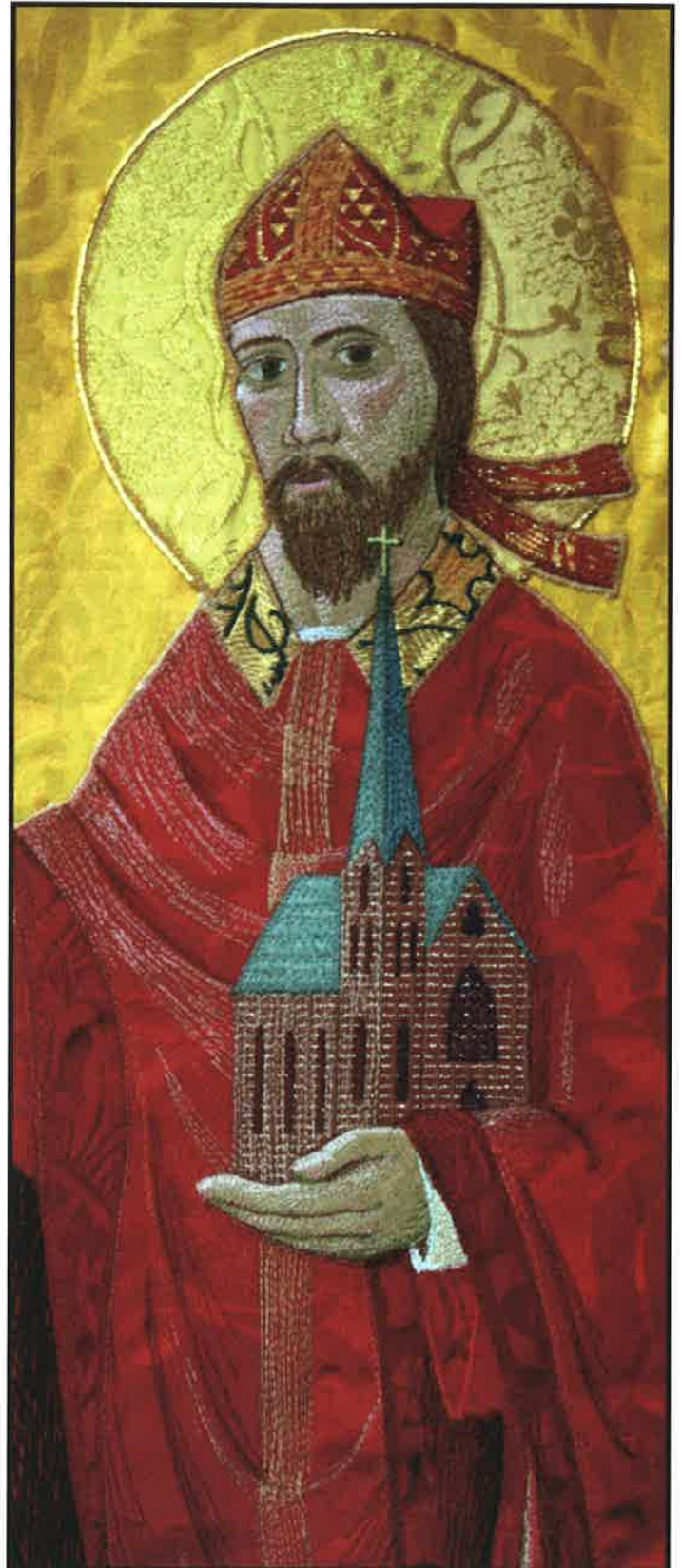

## The Doctor is In

---

*In recognition of National NFP (National Family Planning) Awareness Week, we would like to introduce the newest member of our Freedom FertilityCare Center, Medical Consultant Dr. Alicia Thompson. Dr. Thompson, an OB/Gyn is the wife of Dr. Greg Thompson and mother to three children: Will, Lucy, and Wes. Dr. Thompson was sponsored by the Catholic Foundation to attend the Pope Paul VI Institute last October 2015 and again this April 2016 to be trained in NaPro Technology. NaPro Technology (natural and procreative technology) is the first system to network family planning with reproductive and gynecologic health monitoring and maintenance. Dr. Thompson is a gift to our center and to our entire community*

When considering natural family planning (NFP) as Catholics, it can be viewed in both a moral framework and a scientific one. Those who wish to understand Church teaching on the former can find countless explanations that are succinct, eloquent and thorough, to include *Humanae Vitae*, *Theology of the Body*, among others. A scientific appraisal and understanding can be more difficult to navigate. As a board certified obstetrician gynecologist, I hope to provide education on the scientific basis and merits of NFP.

In gynecology and in the world at large, the term NFP often has derogatory connotations. It has been described as “Roman roulette,” which will inevitably result in a very large family size (by modern standards) as it cannot be relied upon as effective. A more subtle derision is to use the phrase *The Rhythm Method* as synonymous to NFP. Penicillin was a groundbreaking discovery in 1928, yet modern-day antibiotics reflect the incredible gains in scientific knowledge since then. Similarly, the book *The Rhythm*, published in 1932, described an innovative approach to family planning based on discoveries of that era, which served as a springboard for further innovation. This invaluable first step gave rise to today’s modern methods, collectively known as fertility awareness based methods (FABMs).

The scientific merit and effectiveness of FABMs are recognized by the World Health Organization, the American Congress of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, the American Academy of Family Physicians and even Planned Parenthood. The basis for these methods is rooted in well-established scientific truths which have been understood for decades. The general principle underlying all methods, apart from a true calendar rhythm method, involves recording signs and symptoms associated with a woman’s fertile window. The fertile window is the time in a woman’s cycle in which she is capable of becoming pregnant, which is typically 6 days per menstrual cycle. There is a complex hormonal milieu at work that is responsible for the changes a woman observes – including cervical mucus changes, a rise in her temperature, a change in the position and consistency of her cervix, and even urinary excretion of hormones. Depending on the method she chooses, she can identify her fertile window by recording

some or all of these signs, thereby allowing the couple the choice to use identified fertile days to either achieve or avoid pregnancy. When used correctly, the effectiveness rates to avoid pregnancy are > 95% for each method. (<http://who.int/mediacentre/factsheets/fs351/en/>)

As a clinician, my patients that use FABMs are the most informed and attune with their reproductive health. Their charts serve as perfect symptom diaries which may illustrate health or may aid in recognizing disease. Many women can identify signs of infertility prior to even trying to get pregnant. In a world of perfect health education, before puberty a girl would be taught about her body’s physical signs of normal gynecologic health. As she enters puberty and goes through adolescence, she would learn to observe the language of her body to understand her fertility. Ideally, that knowledge would communicate to her the value and dignity of her body. That education would then serve as a lifelong foundation for authentic reproductive health and sexuality.

For all of us, the path to a virtuous life is ever in progress. Aligning our lives to the will of the Father requires an ongoing effort. Whether we seek to use NFP to follow church teaching or because we understand the anthropological truth of fertility being a good in and of itself, FABMs helps us along that path.
