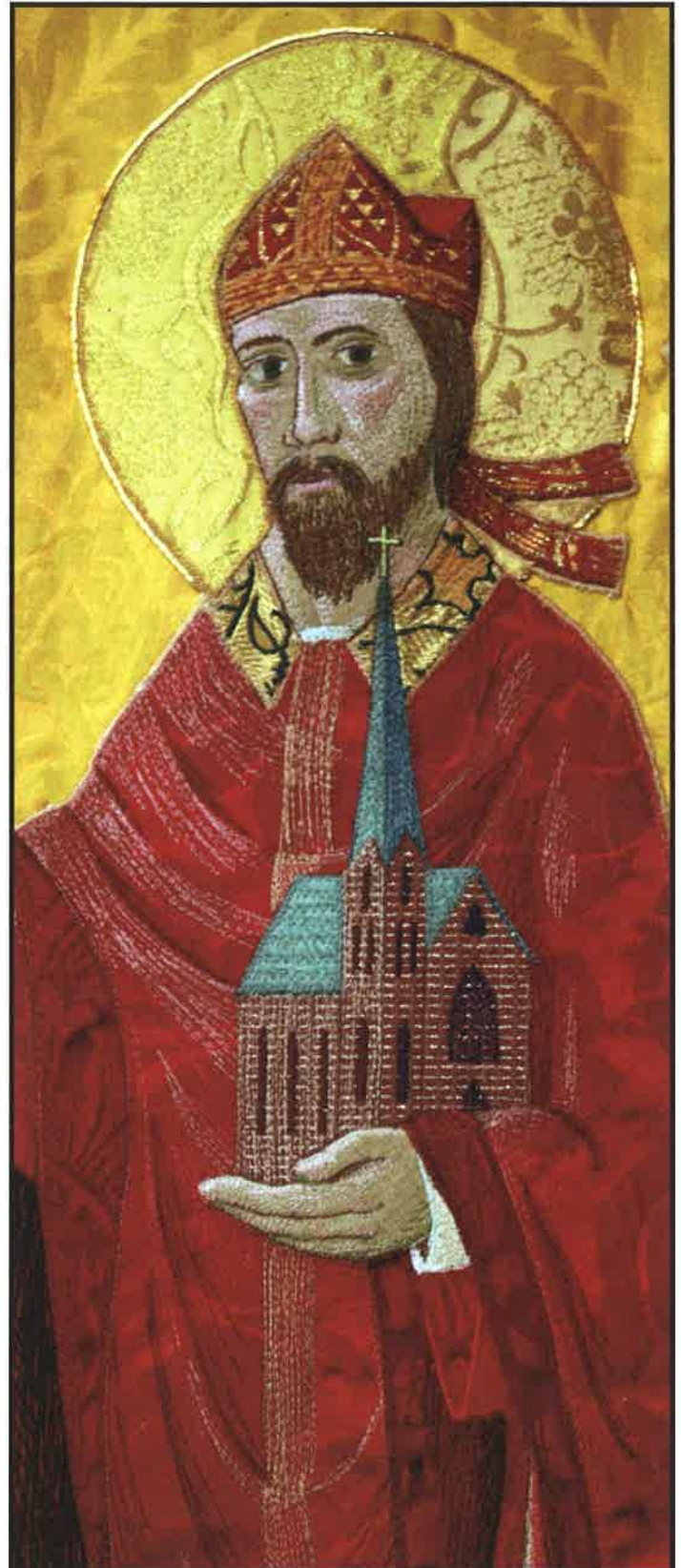

From the Parochial Vicar's Desk...

Our Gospel this weekend invites us to reflect on Jesus' interaction with the woman at the well. She's isolated from the community coming to draw her water at the hottest time of the day instead of the cool of the morning with the other women. Jesus asks her for a drink. There is so much going on and such richness in this passage. Are we isolated with an overuse of social media or electronics? Do we isolate or ignore others we see in our daily lives? Do we have concern for others? Do we have a concern for Jesus as we go about our business each day?

"Dear brothers and sisters, I invite you during this Lent to meditate upon the word of life which Christ left to his Church in order to enlighten the journey of each of her members. Recognize the voice of Jesus who speaks to you, especially during this Lenten season, in the Gospel, in the liturgical celebrations, in the exhortations of your pastors. Listen to the voice of Jesus who, tired and thirsty, says to the Samaritan woman at Jacob's well: "Give me a drink" (Jn 4:7). Look upon Jesus nailed to the Cross, dying, and listen to his faint voice: "I thirst" (Jn 19:28). Today, Christ repeats his request and relives the torments of his Passion in the poorest of our brothers and sisters.

By inviting us through the discipline of Lent to tread the paths of love and hope marked out by Christ, the Church makes us realize that the Christian life involves detachment from superfluous goods, and the acceptance of a poverty which sets us free, and enables us to discover God's presence and to welcome our brothers and sisters with an ever more active solidarity and in an ever wider fellowship." - Pope John Paul II, *Lenten Message 1993*

The LIFE Pregnancy Center

The LIFE Pregnancy Center was recently awarded \$40,500 from The Catholic Foundation, through a vision grant, to fund the 4,000 square foot framing project for the new facility.

The Catholic Foundation awards annual grants to parishes within the 23 county Diocese of Columbus, which addresses the needs of the parish community. St. Colman of Cloyne Catholic Church sponsors the LIFE Pregnancy Center; therefore, the grant application process was made through the church's social impact services. The grant committee considers funding projects that meet the criteria of a sustainability plan, collaborative effort and financial support from multiple sources.

The grant committee looked very favorably on this project due to the fact that our community has been very charitable monetarily, as well as through "sweat equity" and gift-in-kind pledges. Given that, only a limited number of vision grants are distributed annually, the Center is privileged to be chosen as a recipient of this generous sum. LIFE Pregnancy appreciates and is very grateful that The Catholic Foundation bestowed such a substantial grant to the Center.

To date, the campaign has raised 93% (\$370,000) of the \$400,000 projected cost of the new building. The professionally designed facility will create a welcoming environment to serve more parents who need assistance while facing the challenges of an unplanned pregnancy as well as help area youth make responsible and healthy decisions. Above all, the Center will continue to be the service arm of the pro-life movement to advance a culture of life.

Solemn Vespers for the Fourth Sunday in Lent ("Laetare" Sunday) March 26, 2017 at 3:00 PM

The Choir of St. Colman with Strings

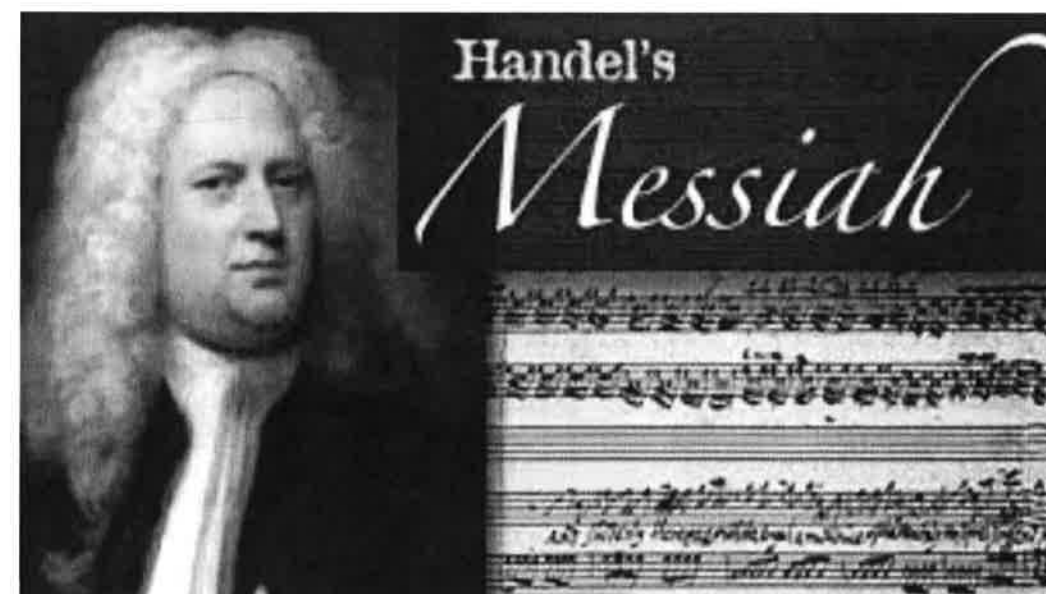
This service, held on one of the two 'Rose' Sundays of the church year, has become a worship and musical tradition at St. Colman.

The Psalms and Canticles are sung to various forms of chant, both plainchant (Gregorian) and Anglican (harmonized).

In addition, as a special musical offering, the choir will perform the first section of Part Two of Handel's 'MESSIAH' with soloists and accompanied by strings. The section to be sung begins with the chorus "Behold the Lamb of God" and continues with the aria "He Was Despised", the choruses "Surely He Has Borne Our Grievs", "And with His Stripes We Are Healed", "All We Like Sheep Are Gone Astray", the recitative "All They That See Him" and concludes with the chorus "He Trusted in God".

This music is completely suited to this day and this service. The New Testament Cantic from the Epistle of Peter is essentially a restatement, almost a direct quote, of some of the passages from Isaiah which form the libretto of this part of the work. This music may not be quite as well-known as some of the portions from the Christmas and Easter sections, but it is easily as dramatic and powerful. Handel's treatment of the words, using every compositional tool he had available, takes them from mere statement to incredibly moving declamation. It is nearly the perfect musical vehicle for the lessons being taught on this day.

Both the themes and the music go right to both the heart and the mind. As a devotional exercise for this time in Lent, it is hard to beat.
