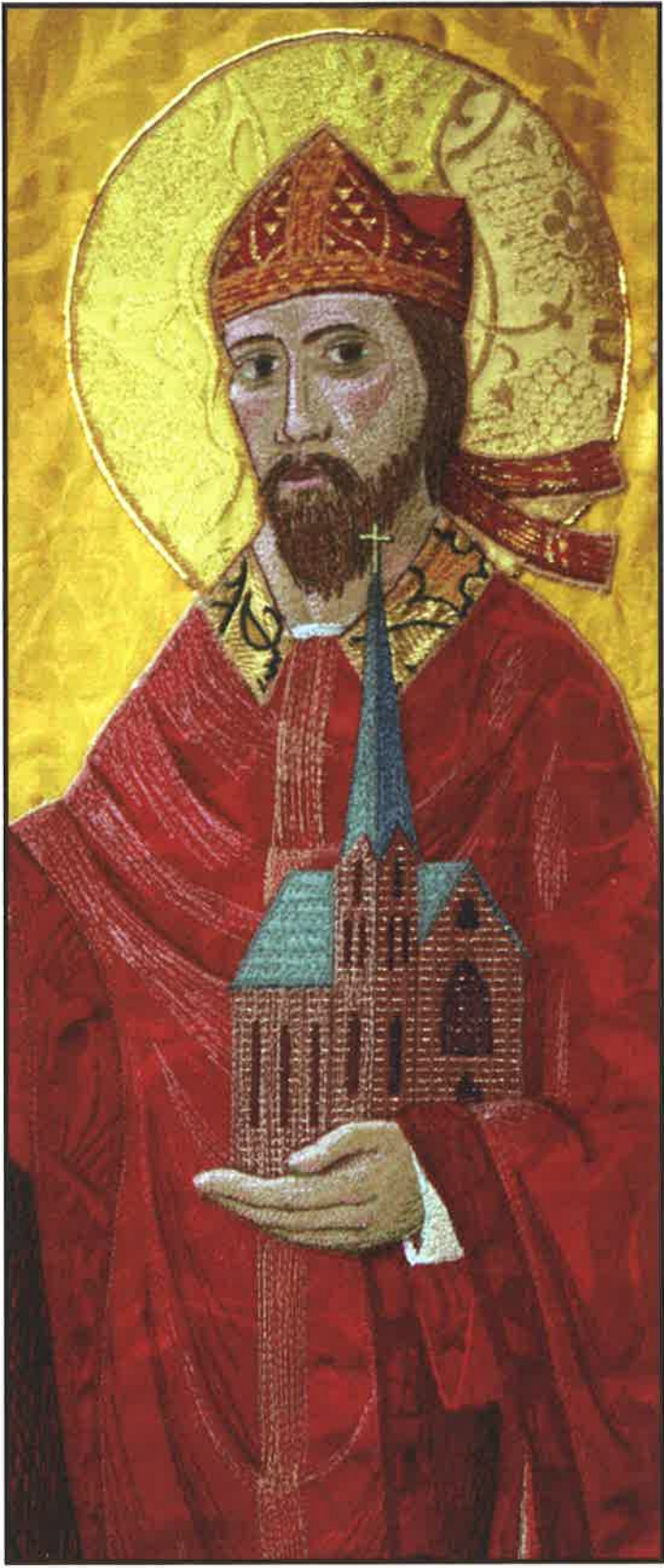

From the Parochial Vicar's Desk...

Happy Labor Day! Many welcome a much needed and refreshing day of rest on this civic holiday. If we have a chance to rest from our labors on Monday, let us take a moment to give thanks to God for the opportunity to work. Work gives us great dignity in cooperating with God's plan to subdue the earth and cultivate it. It allows us to glorify God by the use of our God-given gifts and talents. We're also mindful of those who are unemployed or underemployed and have difficulty in supporting themselves and their families.

Our late Holy Father, St. John Paul II, says this about work in his 1981 encyclical *Laborerm Exercens* (On the Dignity of Human Work): "Toil is something that is universally known, for it is universally experienced. It is familiar to those doing physical work under sometimes exceptionally laborious conditions. It is familiar not only to agricultural workers, who spend long days working the land, which sometimes 'bears thorns and thistles' 17, but also to those who work in mines and quarries, to steel-workers at their blast-furnaces, to those who work in builders' yards and in construction work, often in danger of injury or death. It is likewise familiar to those at an intellectual workbench; to scientists; to those who bear the burden of grave responsibility for decisions that will have a vast impact on society. It is familiar to doctors and nurses, who spend days and nights at their patients' bedsides. It is familiar to women, who, sometimes without proper recognition on the part of society and even of their own families, bear the daily burden and responsibility for their homes and the upbringing of their children. It is familiar to all workers and, since work is a universal calling, it is familiar to everyone."

As we remain in solidarity with one another in our experience of the toil of work, let us work to lift those from the drudgery and hardships of life who don't see purpose in it, who find life and work overly burdensome, and who have just fallen on hard times. Let us lift one another through the work of our prayer so that our coworkers and neighbors will better appreciate seeing the will of God for them in the very ordinary tasks of daily work. Sanctity will be achieved in carrying out our daily, ordinary tasks with joy.

It is hard for me to wrap my head around the fact that we are about to embark on our Fifth season of Concerts in a Country Church in just six weeks!

In many ways, everything we have done up to this point has been leading to the offerings we have for the season: one of the greatest choral works ever penned and a solo recital by our Music Director (who has managed to avoid such until now).

Suffice it to say that if you've enjoyed the programs we have done so far, this year's productions should blow you away! I have talked with many musicians in the Fayette county area and all are in agreement that the performance of the Mozart 'Requiem' on October 15 may well be the most ambitious musical undertaking ever produced in our area. Your faithful choir members have been working on this project for nearly a year and I feel safe in telling you that it is promising to be all that a well-performed rendition of such a masterpiece of music can be! Be prepared to be wowed, moved to shivers and to tears; this is serious stuff!

The 'Requiem' was the last work written by Mozart (a movement from it accompanies his death in the semi-fictional movie 'Amadeus') and it shows that, even though he was dying, his genius-source powers of musical expression were at their peak! You will not want to miss this one!

The solo organ program for April 15, 2018 is the result of thinking "you better do this while you still can" and is also being done in recognition of the wonderful instrument and acoustics we are so fortunate to have at St. Colman Church. The combination deserves the best of organ music and that's what I plan to offer.

I am looking forward to seeing many of you at our programs this year and encourage you to support our efforts not only through tickets and other support but especially to spread the word and invite your family members and friends as well. At least half of our attendees come from out of town, so it would be nice to see an increase in our local support as well.

As always, we are most grateful for your support in the past and hope that our efforts are worthy of it in the future. Thank you for listening!

Our ticket prices have been \$25.00 for all three concerts in each of the past four years; this season is the same price but one less program.
