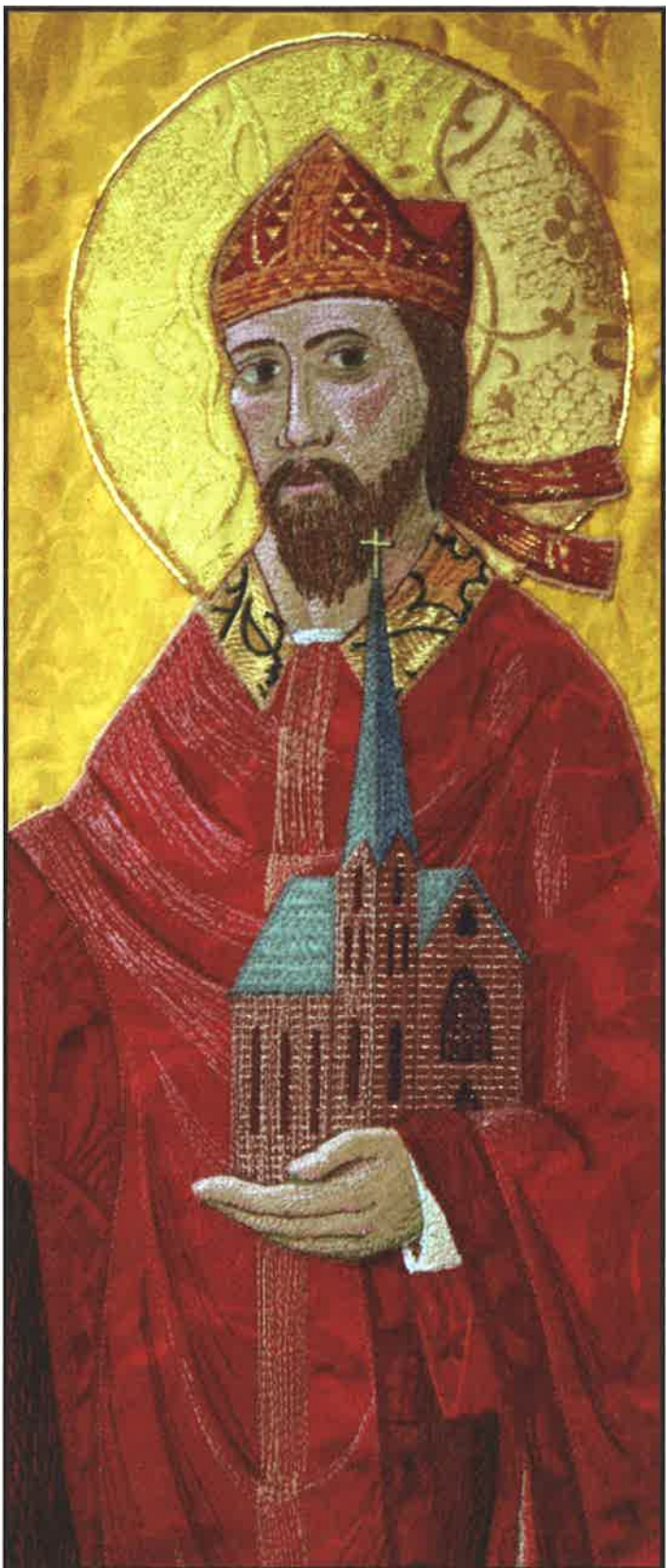

From the Parochial Vicar's Desk...

This is **National Vocations Awareness Week**. Vocations include married life and consecrated single life. In any state in life, whether lay or ordained, married or single, the Lord seeks from us a covenantal commitment. This week, however, we want to focus especially on those visible vocations in service of the Church in the priesthood and religious life. (See the bulletin insert, and some new brochures in the parish hall literature rack.)

We have roughly 90 priests serving 106 parishes in the Columbus Diocese. Dominican Sisters of Mary, Mother of the Eucharist serve the school at St. Michael in Worthington, as just one example of young, joyful women religious serving our diocese. (Their order is based in Ann Arbor, Michigan, so you know they're good and holy!) There are many other women religious orders serving parishes in the diocese, but most notably to us are the beloved Franciscans of the Immaculate Heart of Mary at St. Peter, Chillicothe.

Have you ever suggested to one of our young people that the Lord might be calling them to the priesthood or religious life? Have you ever prayed about this for your son or daughter? If you are high school or college aged, have you ever prayed that the Lord give you the strength to accept such a vocation? These vocations are indispensable for the health and life of the Church. **This week we dedicate our 2 hours of adoration on Tuesday evening to an increase in vocations to the priesthood and religious life in our diocese and especially from our parish.** Adoration is the best place to pray for vocations because in the quiet presence of the Lord, we can cut out the noise and distractions of our lives, and really try to listen to what God wants for us and for his Church. Please spend some time with the Lord in adoration on Tuesday evening from 6-8 p.m. for vocations. Pray also for our son of the parish, Deacon Brett Garland, that he perseveres as he prepares to enter into his vocation to the priesthood in May.

Ordinations Rising—and You Can Help

The number of priests being ordained has risen slightly in recent years, and while ordinations still aren't keeping pace with priests' retirements, there is good news to report. According to CARA's annual survey of soon-to-be-ordained priests, men are being ordained younger and are receiving more encouragement than in past years.¹

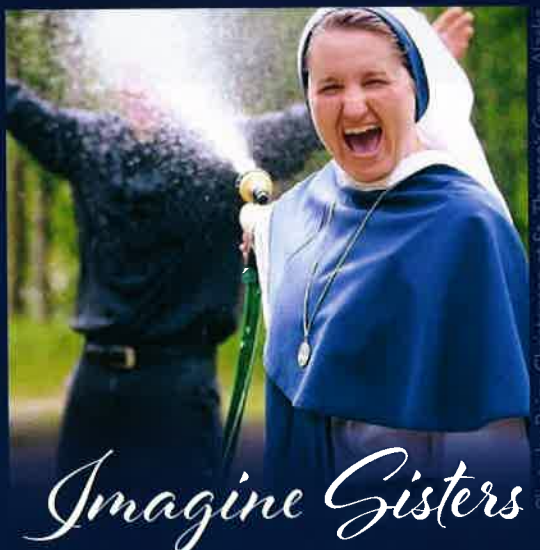
What can *you* do to help more young men discern the priesthood?

- **Encourage teens.** Boys first consider priesthood, on average, at 16.
- **Invite, invite, invite!** 82% of men ordained in 2017 were encouraged to consider priesthood by an average of four people.
- **Promote prayer in the parish.** Before entering seminary, three-quarters of new priests regularly attended Eucharistic Adoration and 69% regularly prayed the rosary.

Do you have someone in mind who may make a good priest? Mention it to him. Even if he's not called, it's a compliment to his faith—one he'll never forget!

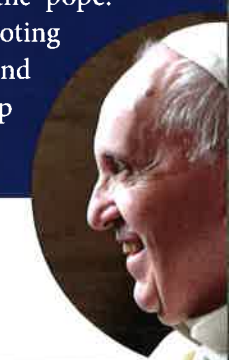
- **Find good information.** Dig into the books, websites, and videos that present a clear Catholic view.
- **Seek Guidance.** Get help from a priest, deacon, or sister you trust. Don't discern alone!
- **Pray Consistently:** Seek the sacraments and pray daily to know God's plan for you. Be patient and give it time. In His will is your peace!



My Friend the Seminarian

Pope Francis wants us to be on a first-name basis with future priests

In a highly-anticipated audience with the Holy Father this summer, 600 members of Serra International (the lay organization that promotes vocations) heard a surprising message: befriend the clergy! "I encourage you to be true friends to seminarians and priests," said the pope. "Show your love for them by promoting vocations and through prayer and pastoral cooperation. Please, keep pressing forward, forward in hope!"

These are not just celebrations of events, but of *new lives!* That's because every vocation involves a serious, life-long commitment for the good of the individual and the growth of the Church.

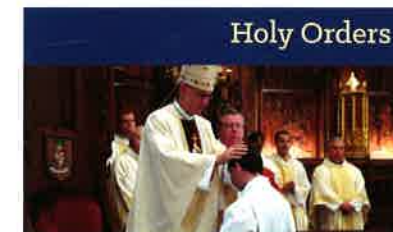
A vocation "roots" a person into a specific life: a way to grow in holiness and help others do the same.

How it's made: The free consent of a man and woman through exchange of vows, and the consummation of the marriage.

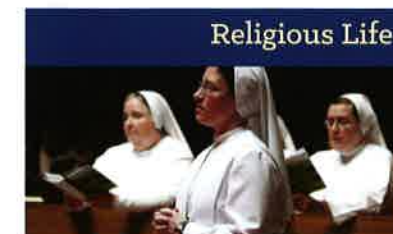
Purpose: A lifelong partnership for the good of the spouses and the raising up of children in the Faith.

Purpose: To preach the gospel of Jesus Christ and bring the sacraments to the faithful.

How it's made: The public vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience in a stable state of life recognized by the Church.

Purpose: Total dedication to God in order to serve the Church, be examples of holiness, and pray for the salvation of the world.
