

rom the Parochial Vicar's Desk...

This weekend begins the new liturgical year. The Church's calendar begins on the first Sunday of Advent. A liturgy is a public prayer of the church. Mass is a Liturgy. The Divine Office, or Liturgy of the Hours, is a liturgy. It is prayed 5 times each day by priests, religious and even lay people as they can fit it into their lives and schedules in the working world. So the First Sunday in Advent liturgical year is a calendar of the public celebrations



of the Church beginning each year with the season of Advent. Lent and the Christmas and Easter seasons are different seasons throughout the liturgical

Something that can help create the experience of a domestic church (Catechism of the Catholic Church #1655 - 1658) in your home this Advent is the presence of an Advent wreath. Consider placing it at the center of your dining room table or kitchen table and lighting it in the evening after dinner and maybe read the reflection and Scripture verse from the Advent Magnificat companion. Asking a child to be the leader each night can help them understand the importance of prayer in the family beyond Mass together and meal prayers.

Lastly, there are many secular forces at work trying to steal away our attention from the true meaning of Christmas. (And it's not even Christmas, yet!) Let's prepare prayerfully during this season of Advent. We'll indeed be buying those gifts to show our love for family and friends, but the most important gift that we must not leave off of our lists is to the one who loves us infinitely. Let's give Jesus the gift of a recollected heart prepared to receive his grace and love on December 25th.


Women of St. Colman Christmas Party


