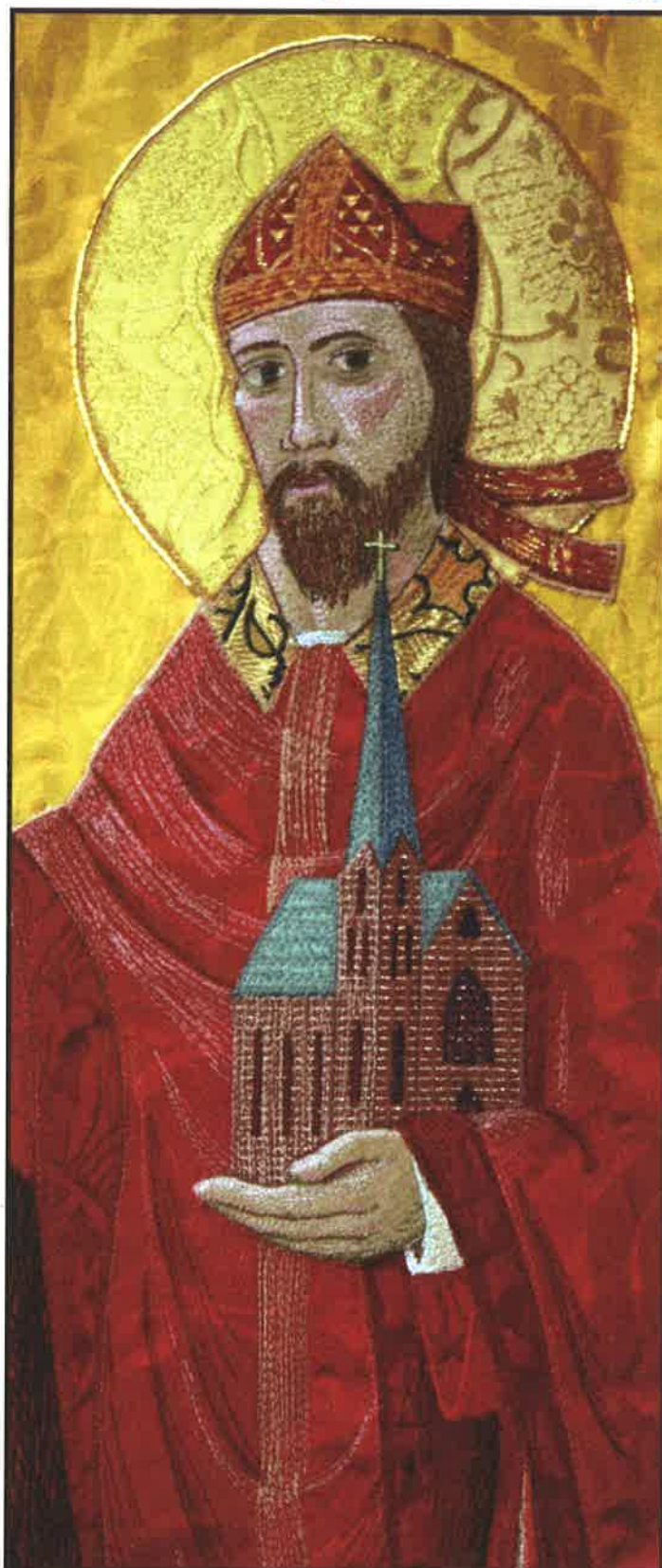

From the desk of the Parochial Vicar...

REMINDER: FAST AND ABSTAIN FROM MEAT ON WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 14 (ASH WEDNESDAY) AND FRIDAY, MARCH 30 (GOOD FRIDAY). ADDITIONALLY, ABSTAIN FROM MEAT ON ALL FRIDAYS IN LENT.

From The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) regarding fasting:

"Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on **fasting** are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When **fasting**, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning **abstinence** from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards."

Fasting is a time honored method of penance that can greatly assist one in gaining self-mastery. That means no snacking on those days, and our meals should be much smaller than normal. Why? Through it we gain self-mastery. We can control our appetites instead of our appetites controlling us. If we deprive the body of something that it can legitimately have in normal circumstances (such as three full meals, or eating meat on other days) then we can much more easily say "No" to those things (sins, vices) that we cannot legitimately have. I would recommend fasting on each Friday in Lent as well, if your health allows it. I know some cannot due to medical conditions.

Suggestions for Lenten prayer, fasting and almsgiving...

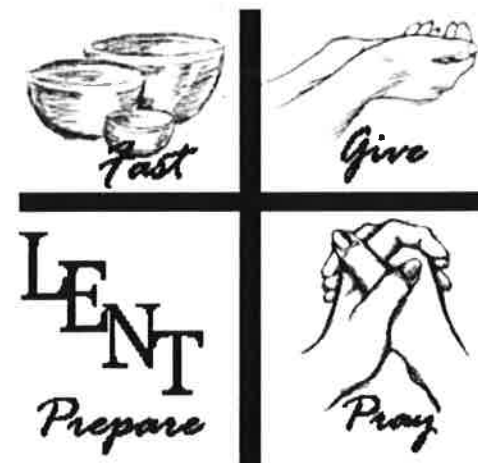
Prayer: Daily Rosary, Weekly adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, 15 minutes of reading Sacred Scripture, participating in the weekly Stations of the Cross.

Fasting: Fasting according to the Church's guidelines above on Fridays or Wednesdays during Lent.

Almsgiving: Put that money you saved from your weekly fasting, Say \$3-5 into your rice bowl or SVdP envelope, so others who don't always have food can eat.

Please be assured of my prayers and penances offered for you during this holy season of Lent.

Rice Bowls

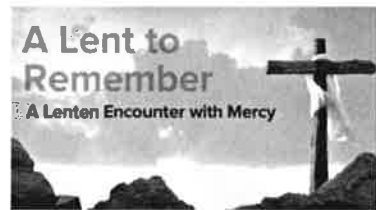

Catholic Foundation Awards The LIFE Pregnancy Center

The LIFE Pregnancy Center acknowledges a \$10,000.00 grant received from the Catholic Foundation to assist funding an exterior beautification project to complement the newly constructed pregnancy medical center. The monies will help finance an outdoor patio setting, signage, landscaping, and the renovation of the perimeter wall in the back of the building.

The grant application was made through the St. Colman of Cloyne Catholic Church's social impact services which supports the work of the Center. The Center has been privileged to be chosen as a recipient of the Catholic Foundation Responsive Grant for the third year. A 2016 grant of \$20,000.00 helped purchase the property and kick-start the capital campaign for the new facility. A 2017 grant of \$40,500.00 helped finance the building's framework.
