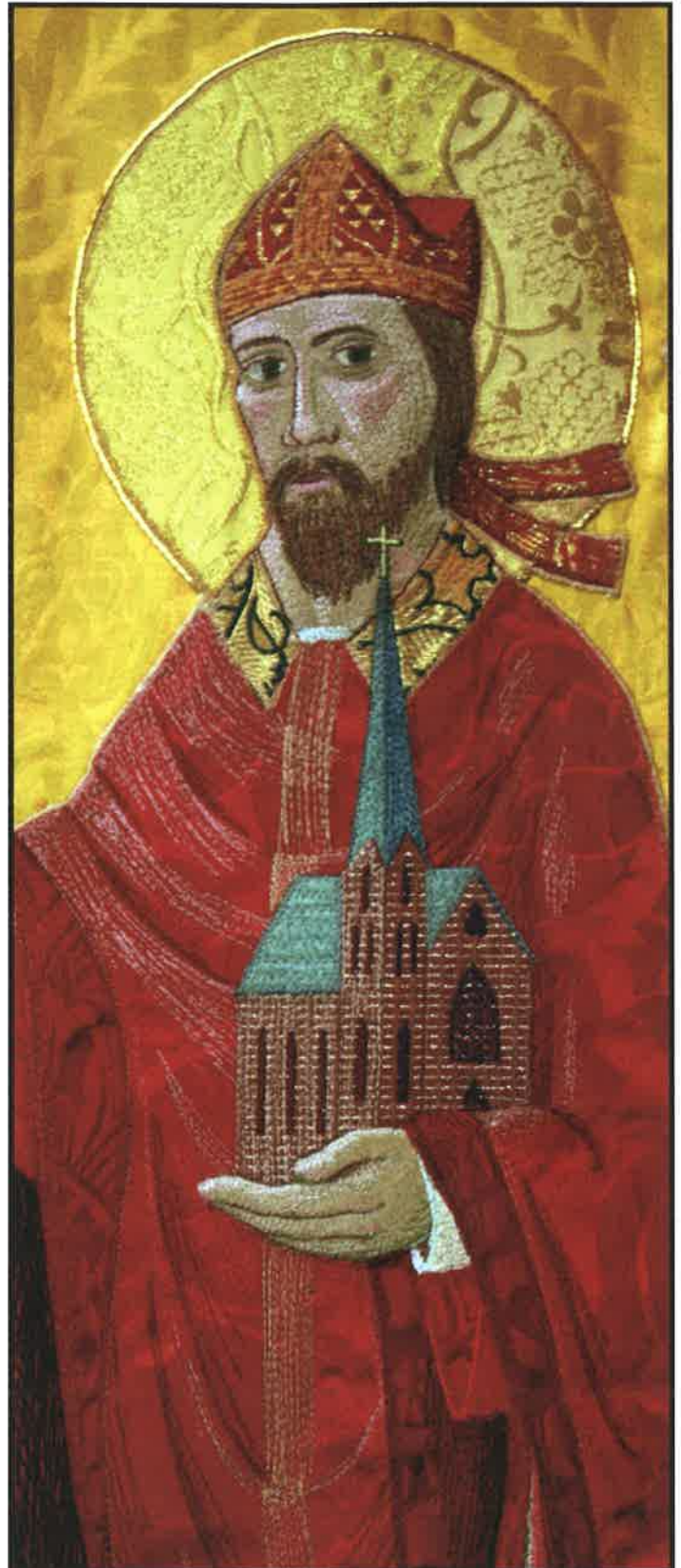

2018 Uganda Mission Team: "Thank You" for Parish Support

The members of the 2018 Uganda Mission Team would like to thank everyone from the Consortium who offered prayers and support for their trip to visit Miryante Orphans' Home this summer. Financial support helped provide:

- water filtration systems in each of the housing units
- equipment for a drip irrigation system
- improvements to the goat barn
- new fencing for the cattle pen
- materials so that the youth in the carpentry program at the technical school could make benches for the church that was recently built on the campus
- religious articles for the church, such as framed Stations of the Cross

Many people sent gifts for the children, and the team was able to provide something special for each child. In addition, the team delivered handmade dresses for all the girls at the orphanage and to children living in child-headed households in the nearby Kyaka II Refugee Settlement. The team was able to spend a day making rosaries with the children, and also played games and worked on crafts throughout the visit. A Mass or prayer service was offered daily.

September 21: St. Matthew, Apostle and Evangelist, patron of accountants, bankers and bookkeepers

RECIPE: St. Matthew "PayDay" bars (from catholiccuisine.com)

Ingredients:

1 16 oz. jar dry roasted peanuts 1 can sweetened condensed milk
3 tablespoons butter 2 cups miniature marshmallows
1 (10 oz) bag peanut butter chips

Directions:

Grease the bottom and sides of a 9x13 pan. Pour half of the peanuts into the pan. Over medium low heat, melt butter and chips. Remove from heat and mix in sweetened condensed milk. Stir in marshmallows, do not melt marshmallows. Spoon mixture over peanuts in pan, pat down. Top with remaining peanuts and press down to help adhere the top layer of peanuts. Chill until set.

Timely Tips for Tots at Mass:

Do sit up front. Little ones can be amazingly attentive at Mass....but they like to see what is happening, not just the backs of others.

If possible, hold them in your arms until they are 3 years. By then they have learned Mass is a time to be still and to stay in the pew and they have likely learned some responses by being held so close. If they get loud or disruptive while holding, take them to the vestibule and hold them there until they settle. Yes, sometimes this is the whole of Mass! But with no visuals and no running about, they usually find the pew a better option! Your efforts will help them grow to love the Lord and the Holy Mass!
