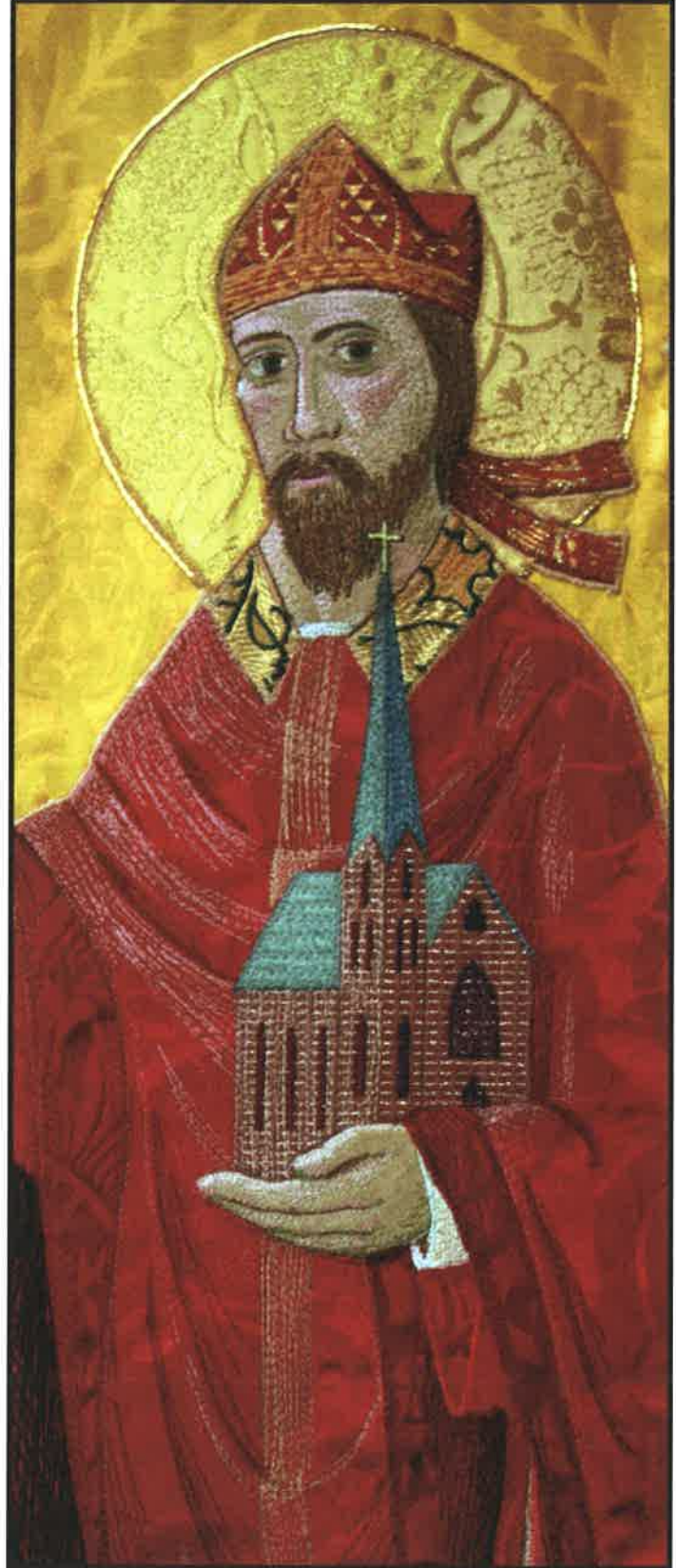

The human being is entitled to such rights, in **every phase of development** - from conception until natural death; and in every condition, whether healthy or sick, whole or handicapped, rich or poor."

Please make a point to read the LIFE inserts that will be in the bulletin during the weekends of October, continually educating yourself on the issues. As Catholics, we have a pressing obligation to be in the vanguard of the advance of a culture of life.

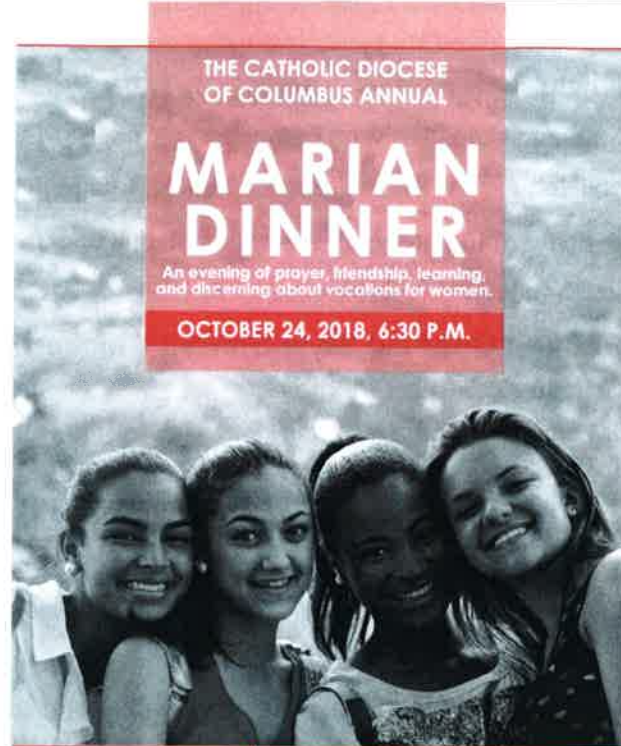

Living the Liturgical Year

Celebrating Saints and Feasts to Enrich Hearts and Homes

October 4: St. Francis of Assisi, founder of the Friars Minor (Franciscans) and the Poor Clares

Patron of animals, families, merchants, peace and more...

This beautiful saint was born in the 12th century to a noble merchant. He was well educated and lived a worldly life until a vision from Christ during his imprisonment in Perugia changed his life. He left wealth and family behind and embraced complete poverty; wearing ragged clothes, begging for food and preaching peace. His radical life attracted followers and soon the Friars Minor was born. St. Francis was the first recorded person to receive the stigmata.

St. Francis' and the Wolf of Gubbio is a story of Francis' deep trust in God and his love for all God's creatures. If you don't know the story, read it here <http://tamingthewolf.com/saint-francis-and-the-wolf/>.

In honor of this story, try this classic Italian dish from the region of Umbria in Italy (Gubbio is in this region).

RECIPE: Gubbian Style Stewed Chicken (from
Catholicculture.org) **Ingredients:**

1/4 cup extra virgin olive oil 1 large white onion, chopped 3
1/2 lbs. cut-up, bone in chicken 1/4 cup white wine vinegar
4 fresh sage leaves or 1 tsp. dried 2 sprigs rosemary, or 2 tsp
dried 1/4 cup dry white wine, Italian preferred
1 14 oz. can San Marzano tomatoes,
pureed salt and pepper to taste

Directions:

Using a large skillet, heat oil on medium low and add onions, cooking until translucent. Raise heat to medium high and add well dried chicken pieces. Cook until nicely browned on all sides, about 5 minutes. Add wine vinegar and allow to evaporate. Lower the heat to low and add sage and rosemary. Continue cooking over low heat for 15 minutes. Raise temperature to high, add wine and tomatoes and season with salt and pepper. Continue cooking, uncovered for 25 minutes or until juices thicken a bit and chicken is tender. Arrange on a bed of buttered linguini and pour sauce over.

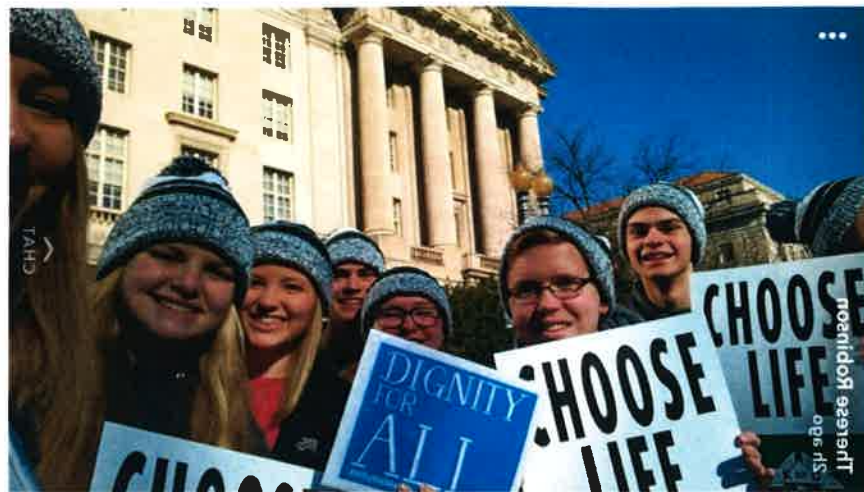

If you are planning / considering attending our March for Life 2019 pilgrimage, please fill out the following information, include a \$30 deposit and *return to the St. Colman Parish Office by December 1, 2018.* (If the deposit is a financial hardship, please contact Stephanie or Tina in the Parish Office . . . no one is refused attendance for this reason.) There will be additional paperwork to complete prior to leaving for Washington in January. All adults over 18 and out of High School must be “safe environment compliant”, meaning you have taken the PGC training session and had a BCI fingerprint background check completed.

CONCERTS IN A COUNTRY CHURCH 2018 – 2019 SEASON

MASS IN C MAJOR by Ludwig van Beethoven
SUNDAY, OCTOBER 14 at 3:00 PM

Last year's featured work was Mozart's 'Requiem' and was received with great enthusiasm. This year's first program will utilize the same musical forces of chorus, soloists and orchestra in a concert performance of the Mass in C Major by Ludwig van Beethoven.

This is an utterly stunning, even if underperformed, work of quintessential Beethoven. It has all the charm, loveliness of melody, surprises of harmony, dramatic exposition and expression and exquisite serenity that one expects from the best of a genius composer. It is probably a once-in-a-lifetime event for our community. Member of the Choir of St. Colman along with invited guests, professional soloists and a 22 piece chamber orchestra will perform.

The second program, 'Playing with the Big Boys, part 2' will be Sunday, April 28, 2019 at 3:00 PM. Like last year's concert, it will be a program of solo organ works by major composers as well as some lighter fare.

Season tickets (covering both concerts) are \$25.00 each and guarantee ticket holders seats in the reserved section of the church, where total seating is limited to 200. Season tickets may also be purchased at the door. Single event tickets, if available, are \$20.00 for the Beethoven and \$10.00 for the organ program and must be purchased at the door.
