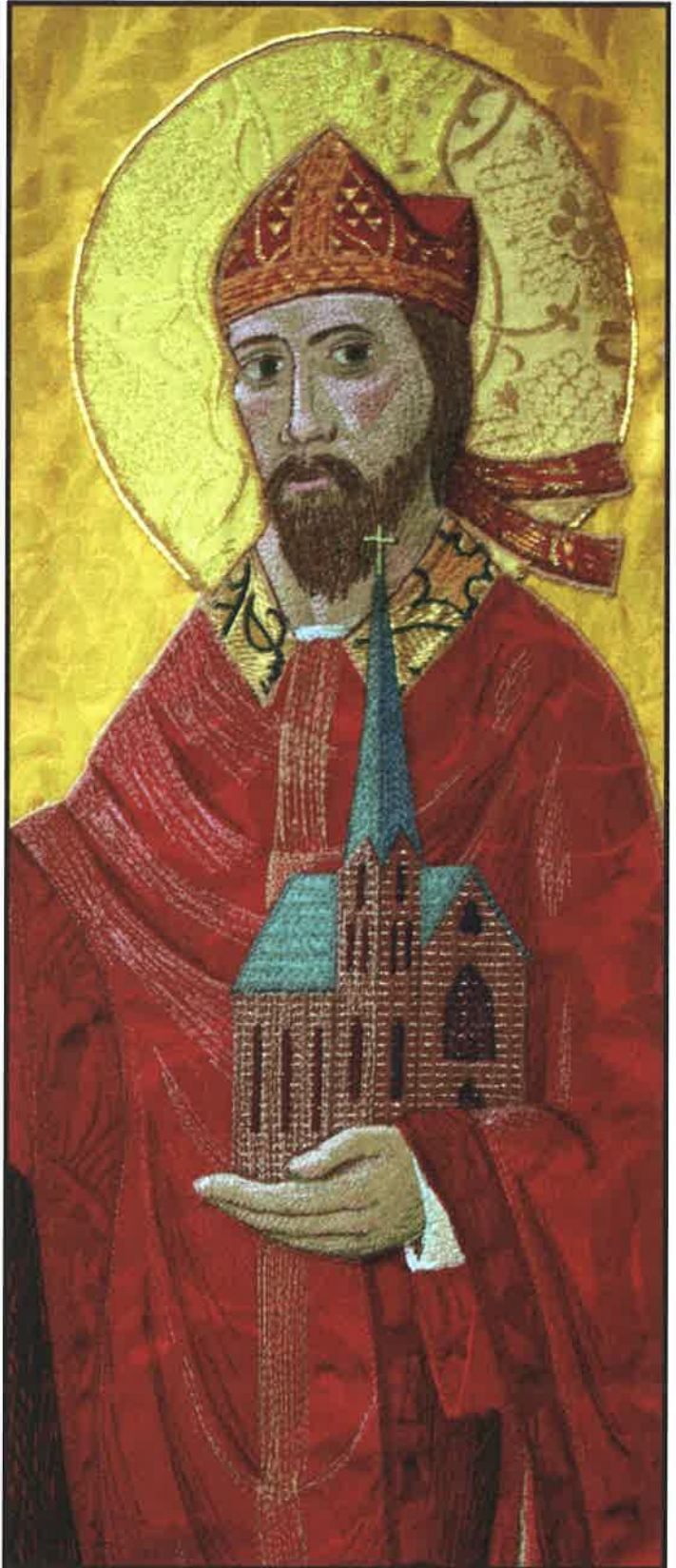

From the Desk of Fr. Dooley...

The Scripture readings from last weekend contained the themes of patience and preparation for the coming Messiah. We slightly shift gears for this Second Sunday of Advent as we look to St. John the Baptist as our ultimate role model. It becomes more clear why we are making this time to prepare for the coming of the Lord. Once we learn to say 'yes' to the Spirit, we begin to formulate our mission as disciples.

Clearly, John the Baptist heard this invitation and proclaimed "a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins." Many people thought that John the Baptist was deranged and a complete outcast. He is in the desert eating locusts and honey for crying out loud! But as we see, John the Baptist is the most sane person during his time. He is simply using his voice to prepare for The Voice. In other words, the desert is not an empty void, but one where we find ourselves by proclamation.

The Gospel begins to list all these other important names in the Judah province of the Roman Empire. These individuals controlled the political sphere during Jesus' time, but all that falls apart compared to The Voice of liberation from sin, darkness and despair. Let us use our voices this Advent to prepare and say: "Come Lord Jesus!"

As a reminder, join us for our traditionally held **Gaudete Sunday Lessons and & Carols on Sunday December 16th at 3:00pm**. Also, our **Advent Penance Service will be on Monday December 17th at 7:00pm**. We will have four to five priests present to hear Confessions.

Living the Liturgical Year

Celebrating Saints and Feasts to Enrich Hearts and Homes

December 12: Our Lady of Guadalupe, Empress of the Americas, Patroness of the Unborn

Our Lady appeared to a poor Aztec Indian convert named Juan Diego (whose feast day is December 9) in 1531. He was on his way to Mass (a 5 mile trip on foot) when she appeared to him on Tepeyac Hill, just outside of Mexico City. She asked him to go to the Bishop of Mexico City and ask him to build a church on the hill. The Bishop was skeptical and asked for a sign. Mary gave Juan Diego roses in the middle of winter which he gathered in his tilma (an Indian cloak made of cactus fiber). When Juan let the roses fall from his tilma upon returning to the presence of the Bishop, there was a miraculous image of Our Lady imprinted on it. This tilma, which should have disintegrated after 20 years, now nearly 500 years old, can still be seen with the beautiful image of Our Lady as fresh as the day she left it, in the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City! The Bishop had the church built on the hill and in a short period of time nearly 8 million people converted to Catholicism. We always celebrate Our Lady of Guadalupe's feast day with a Mexican dish or two. This one is about as easy as it gets.

3 Ingredient Crockpot Chicken Tacos

- 1 1/2 lbs boneless, skinless, chicken breasts
- 1 packet taco seasoning
- 1 (16 oz) jar salsa

Place chicken breasts in bottom of slow cooker sprayed with cooking spray. Sprinkle with taco seasoning and cover with salsa. Cook on low about 6 hours or on high for about 4 hours. Just before serving, shred chicken with 2 forks then stir to distribute salsa throughout. Serve immediately with soft or hard taco shells and desired toppings.
