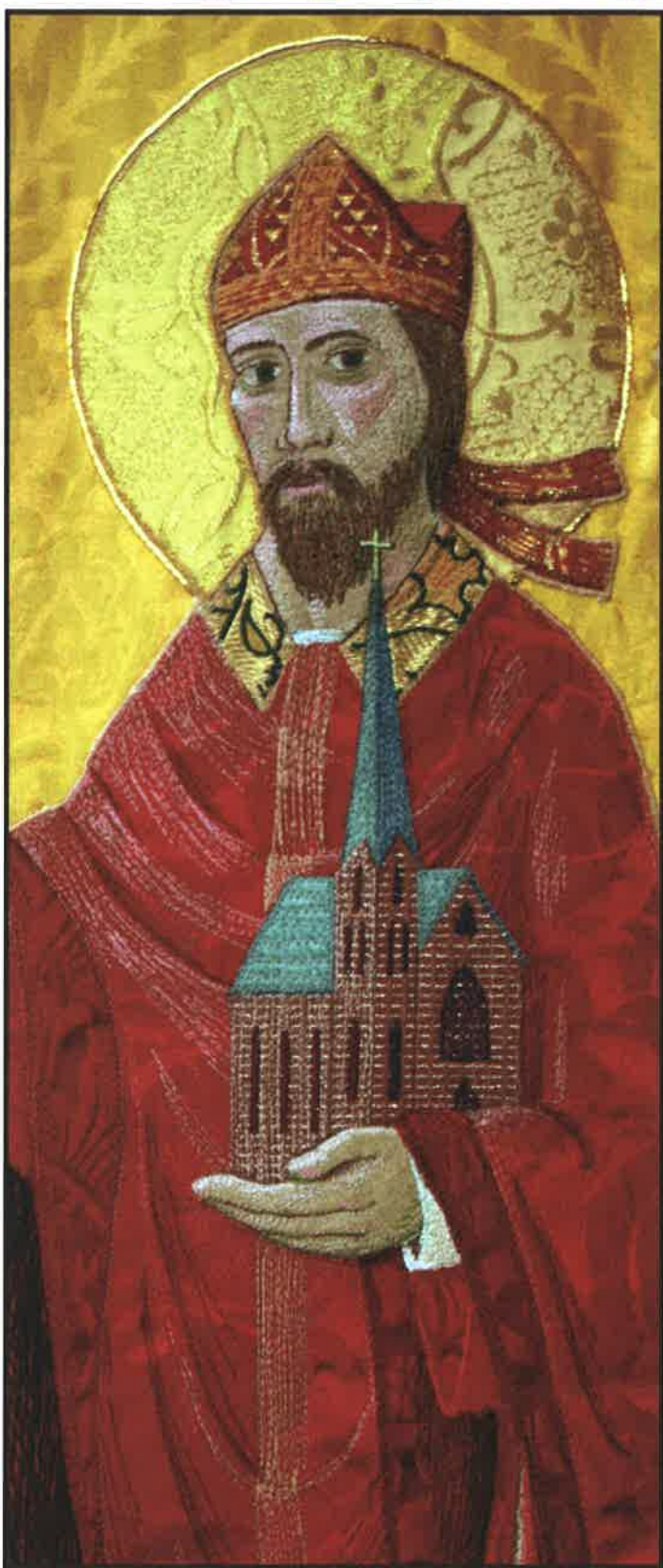

Confession Guide for Adults

Seven Steps to a Better Confession

Whether it's been awhile since your last confession or you go regularly, Father Geoffrey A. Brooke, Jr. has seven tips to make the experience more fruitful.

Prepare with an examination of conscience. "Just as it is with tests and interviews, so it is also true with confession," Father Brooke says. "It is better to prepare."

Arrive early. "Confessions are no different than life. 'You snooze, you lose,'" says Father Brooke. Get there early to avoid a long line so you don't feel rushed, he adds.

Be specific, but not too detailed. "The church asks us to confess our sins in both kind and number," Father Brooke explains, but that doesn't mean providing unnecessary information.

Remember, it's not a counseling office. If you walk out of confession saying the priest's advice was terrible and questioning the value of the sacrament, then there's a problem, says Father Brooke. "If you need counseling, make an appointment with the priest. If you want God's healing grace, go to confession."

Try not to over-explain. You don't have to explain the theology behind why what you did is a sin, Father Brooke says. But if you're unsure, it's better to ask.

Go regularly. Father Brooke recommends going to confession once a month so that individuals "grow in self-awareness and in their relationship with God."

Fear not. Don't worry, Father Brooke says "the priest doesn't desire to remember your sins." Focus on the bigger picture and "be not afraid of receiving God's merciful love."

EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE

1. *I am the Lord your God. You shall not have strange gods before me.*

- Do I give God time every day in prayer?

2. *You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.*

- Have I used God's name in vain: lightly or carelessly?
- Have I been angry with God?
- Have I wished evil upon any other person?
- Have I insulted a sacred person or abused a sacred object?

3. *Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day.*

- Have I deliberately missed Mass on Sundays or Holy Days of Obligation?
- Have I tried to observe Sunday as a family day and a day of rest?
- Do I do needless work on Sunday?

4. *Honor your father and your mother.*

- Do I honor and obey my parents?
- Have I neglected my duties to my spouse and children?
- Have I given my family good religious example?
- Do I try to bring peace into my home life?
- Do I care for my aged and infirm relatives?

5. *You shall not kill.*

- Have I had an abortion or encouraged or helped anyone to have an abortion?
- Have I physically harmed anyone?
- Have I abused alcohol or drugs?
- Did I give scandal to anyone, thereby leading him or her into sin?
- Have I been angry or resentful?
- Have I harbored hatred in my heart?
- Have I mutilated myself through any form of sterilization?
- Have I encouraged or condoned sterilization?
- Have I engaged, in any way, in sins against human life such as artificial insemination or in vitro fertilization?
- Have I participated in or approved of euthanasia?

6. *You shall not commit adultery.*

- Have I been faithful to my marriage vows in thought and action?
- Have I engaged in any sexual activity outside of marriage?
- Have I used any method of contraception or artificial birth control in my marriage?
- Has each sexual act in my marriage been open to the transmission of new life?
- Have I been guilty of masturbation?
- Do I seek to control my thoughts and imaginations?
- Have I respected all members of the opposite sex, or have I thought of other people as mere objects?
- Have I been guilty of any homosexual activity?
- Do I seek to be chaste in my thoughts, words, actions?
- Am I careful to dress modestly?

7. *You shall not steal.*

- Have I stolen what is not mine?
- Have I returned or made restitution for what I have stolen?
- Do I waste time at work, school, and home?
- Do I gamble excessively, thereby denying my family of their needs?
- Do I pay my debts promptly?
- Do I seek to share what I have with the poor?
- Have I cheated anyone out of what is justly theirs, for example creditors, insurance companies, big corporations?

8. *You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.*

- Have I lied? Have I gossiped?
- Do I speak badly of others behind their back?
- Am I sincere in my dealings with others?
- Am I critical, negative or uncharitable in my thoughts of others?
- Do I keep secret what should be kept confidential?
- Have I injured the reputation of others by slanders?

9. *You shall not desire your neighbor's wife.*

- Have I consented to impure thoughts?
- Have I caused them by impure reading, movies, television, conversation or curiosity?
- Do I pray at once to banish impure thoughts and temptations?
- Have I behaved in an inappropriate way with members of the opposite sex: flirting, being superficial, etc.?

10. *You shall not desire your neighbor's goods.*

- Am I jealous of what other people have?
- Do I envy the families or possessions of others?
- Am I greedy or selfish?
- Are material possessions the purpose of my life?

Celebrating Saints and Feasts to Enrich Hearts and Homes

December 21: St. Peter Canisius, Priest and Doctor of the Church, Patron of Germany

Peter Canisius was born in Nijmegen, Holland in 1521 at the very time Luther had started to rebel against the Church. He joined the newly founded Jesuit Order and was ordained a priest in 1546. He was sent to Germany and the first superior of the German province of Jesuits. From there he began his remarkable work in the Counter-Reformation through his prodigious writings, powerful preaching and founding of dozens of colleges. It is primarily through his efforts that Central Europe was brought back to the True Faith. In honor of St. Peter's patronage of Germany we decided to make this simple no bake cookie that was a favorite of the famous Trapp family (think Sound of Music) of German occupied Austria.

Rum Balls

1/2 pound vanilla wafers	1/2 cup light corn syrup
2 tsp cocoa powder	1/4 cup rum (or brandy)
1 cup pecans, finely chopped	Confectioner's sugar

Grind wafers very fine. Add nuts, cocoa, syrup and rum. Stir until well blended. Dust hands with confectioners' sugar and roll mixture into balls the size of a walnut.

Let stand for about an hour to dry partially. Then roll in confectioners' sugar. (from: *Around the Year with the Trapp Family*).

From the Desk of Fr. Dooley...

A blessed Gaudete Sunday to you! Are you ready for a break?

Today, we take a break from the penitential nature of the season, and we reflect on the joy of the Lord's arrival. The word *gaudete* means "rejoice", and this comes from today's liturgy: "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near" (Philippians 4:5). You will notice that today we light the rose candle, and the priest may even wear a rose vestment. (Some of these 'rose' vestments look like something from Pepto-Bismol!) The rose color signifies that we are halfway there and that this season will conclude soon.



Sometimes we experience anxiety in our lives when we wait for something to happen. The anxiety is felt by the crowds in the Gospel as many thought John was the Messiah. The crowd asks: "What do we do now?" However, John tells them that their anxiety will melt away as the baptism of the Holy Spirit. Someone else is coming.

The crowds had their worries and we have ours in the year 2018. Our questions and thoughts are much different though: What do I need to do before Christmas day? I still need to get my shopping done and Christmas cards out. I need to get my travel plans together. It can be overwhelming.

In his 2014 Gaudete Sunday homily, Pope Francis said that Gaudete Sunday is known as the "Sunday of joy," and that instead of fretting about "all they still haven't done to prepare for Christmas, people should "think of all the good things life has given you." A good reminder for all of us. Take a break and rejoice! The Son of God didn't come to exhaust us by our giving of gifts and sending Christmas cards. The Messiah came to free us and to fulfill our desires of love and peace.

LESSONS AND CAROLS FOR ADVENT
Why bother?

It probably goes like this: every year I say, "This is crazy, I'm going to change the way I do Christmas!" and every year sees the same old rat-race, hustle-bustle, and flurry of activities that leave one exhausted and frazzled. The assault seems to start earlier every year; I noticed Christmas music before Thanksgiving this year and thought I'd been caught in some time-warp. Christmas – as the songs and cards so often say – is supposed to be about joy and peace but commercial lunacy seems to call the shots. Sunday afternoon (December 16) at St. Colman at 3:00, we will have a brief opportunity to break that cycle. The Service of Lessons and Carols for Advent is a slow-down-and-listen time, a time to focus on Christmas preparation based on scripture not sales, a time to put the fact of the birth of Jesus into perspective in our lives and for all of history.

Through the very short season of Advent (barely more than three weeks this year) we hear selections from the prophecies that lead up to Christmas, but we rarely get to hear the development of this story all in a piece, from the 'fall of Adam' to 'the Word made flesh'. The Service of Lessons and Carols does just that in a series of nine readings, accompanied by anthems and carols that emphasize each reading and plumb the depths of their meaning. This is NOT your 'Hallmark' Christmas service!

Lessons and Carols, as is also the season of Advent itself, almost a schizophrenic event. It is really speaking of two things at once: 1) the fore-seeing of the coming of Jesus, the Christ-child – amidst feelings of peace and love and joy; AND the fore-telling of his coming AGAIN, in glory as judge of all creation! The latter is, in many ways, a very frightening prospect! Are we not perhaps a bit like St. Augustine (paraphrased): "Oh, fix me up, Lord, but not just yet". However, no amount of proper fear ever overcomes the longing for His Presence and the desire to 'go home' that is built into each of us. This aspect of Advent is emphatically demonstrated in Lessons and Carols and, I think, is the main reason for the world-wide popularity of the service. It lays out and musically exemplifies, in no uncertain terms, the truth of Christmas that no amount of hull-a-balloo can argue with. Join us for this beautiful way of preparing for Christmas this year.
