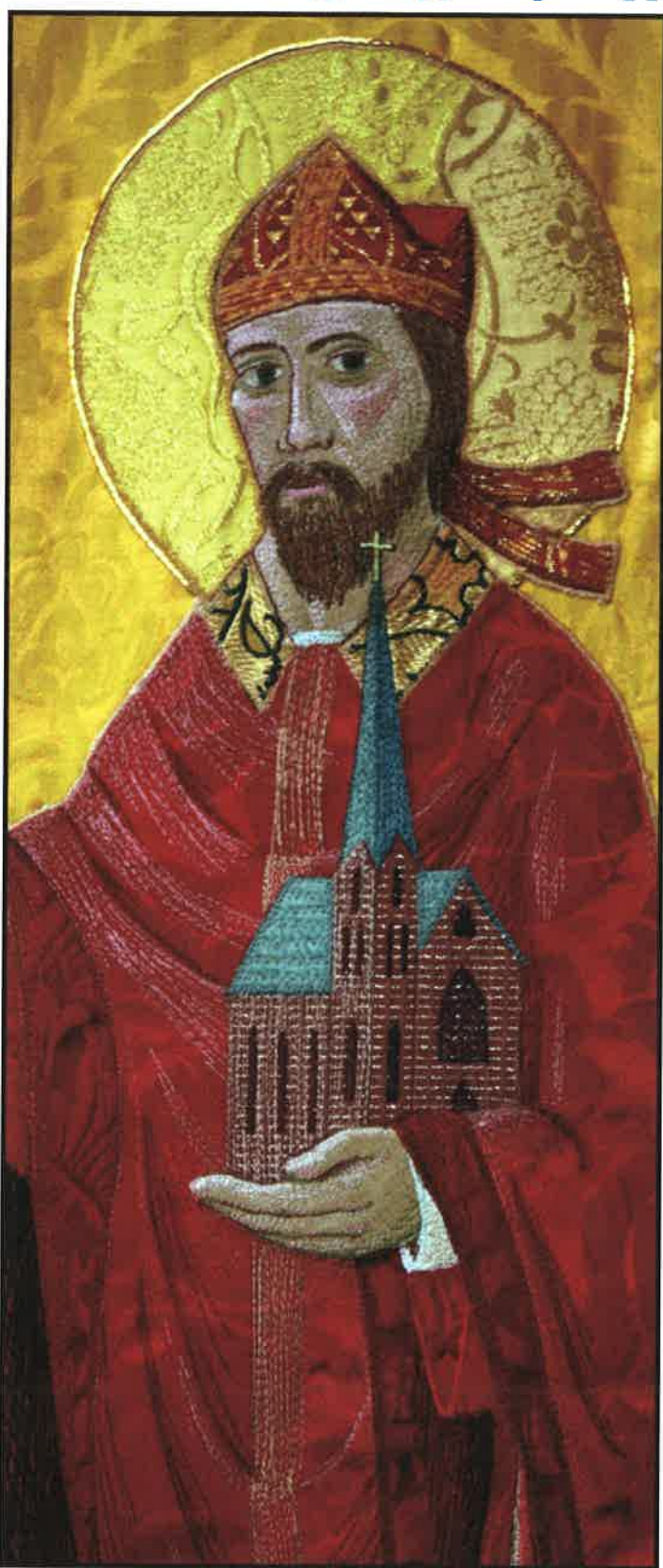

Book Notes, by Mary Lorane Davis

There are many interesting books for all ages in the St. Colman library. It is open every weekday morning from 9am-1pm (same as Parish Office hours) and on Sundays after Mass.

Do you read a story to your children before they go to bed? Here are some suggestions...

- ♦ *Bible Stories* by Michael Paydos has 100 short stories from Genesis to St. Paul in Rome. This is a good way to introduce famous tales of famous people they should know.
- ♦ *Tell Me the Secrets* by Max Lucado: While playing baseball, Eric hits a high ball and breaks a window in the Shadow House, a large neglected house nobody ever goes into. Landon and his sister, Shannon, persuade Eric to go with them to see if anyone lives there. A huge shadowy man holds the ball and asks, "Is this what you are looking for"? Quite a riveting opening!
- ♦ *Our Lady of Kibehe*, by Immaculee Ilibagiza: Every Catholic has heard about the Blessed Mary's visit to the three children of Fatima. Has anyone heard of the visions of the Blessed Mother to the village of Kibelo, Rwanda? The visions came between 1981-1989. This fascinating account is a must-read for lovers of Our Lady.

Michael Pennock's book, *Questions from Seventh Period*, helps teens find answers to questions they have about ethics, sex, confession and headlines about the Church in present time.

From the Desk of Fr. Dooley...

"Brothers and Sisters: As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are all one body, so also Christ" (from our Second Reading this weekend).

We hear in Paul's Letter to the Corinthians that we are one body in Christ. The body is complex, but it has one goal: movement toward Jesus Christ. Over the past 70 years, theologians began to describe the Church in these similar ways; the Church is the Body of Christ. Paul was addressing the divisions of the Church in Corinth, especially due to the lax morals and discipline. It is clear that this text from Paul still applies today. Unfortunately, the Church faces some of these divisions, and we can be tempted to be in separate "camps" or "tribes." This disunity can apply to moral teachings, church leadership, and even to the liturgy.

We may not know it (because we live normal lives- thank God), but liturgy can be a dividing point for many in the Church. I recall in seminary, there was always an excitement among many about vestments and chalices and that was it: that is the liturgy. Lots of nonsensical talk and 'liturgical' discussions that would probably bore the general public. Given how I was raised, I could picture my parents saying to me, "This is missing the entire point" and "This is the opposite of normal adult Christian behavior". Instead, we should be asking, "How is the liturgy celebrated? Are we humble when we approach the liturgy? Do we understand what is happening?" These are important questions to ask. It is necessary to give our best, but Mass is much more than vestments and rubrics (although important). I've just finished the book entitled *The Mass* by Fr. Josef Jungmann, S.J. (1889-1975), which gives a spiritual and historical summary of the Mass from the Last Supper until 1970. In this work, he cites some of the changes and developments in the Mass over the centuries. We see differences between the Western and Eastern church and even in other specific areas. For example, what type of bread was used in a region or where the altar was located in the church/house. In summary, Jungmann reminds us that the nature and purpose of the Mass always remains, but styles may change over time. This is so important to keep in mind.

The liturgy is never to be used as a weapon for an agenda, and it is not a time machine. When we offer the Eucharist, we become part of the divine plan of redemption. Christ is present in the here and now: the Word, the assembly gathered, the priest, and most especially in the Eucharist. The Church cannot go back to how things were in 1500, 1962 or 1985. The liturgy fuels us as the Body of Christ to meet and address the demands of today. When

we worship, we are one united with Christ. We come from different backgrounds and this adds to the richness of the Body of Christ.

In the liturgy, we are unified with the living and the dead. Those individuals who have gone before us were fed by that same Eucharist. In conclusion, Jungmann, S.J. leaves us with this powerful statement on the liturgy: "Of all the attempts at change and adaptation, there remains that solid, constant stable. For two millenniums, generation after generation, God's people have been gathering together around the sacrament of the sacrifice of Christ offered on the Cross. Through all these centuries people have found divine support in it, have drawn strength and courage for heroic renunciation, or for mighty deeds, or even for the quiet heroism of fulfilling their duties in the silent routine of daily life." Let's take to heart what we pray, say, and do in the liturgy. May Paul's words ring true to us, "You are Christ's body".

Three other items:

Next weekend, we will have the St. Blaise Blessing of Throats after the Masses. The feast of St. Blaise is on February 3rd. He was a bishop in the region of Armenia in the early 300s. St. Blaise is the patron of those with throat illnesses. According to one tradition, he cured a young boy who was choking on a fish bone. The blessing is as follows: "By the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every illness of the throat and from every other evil..." Anyone can receive this blessing regardless of age. You do not have to be Catholic to receive it.

On the weekend of February 10th and 11th, the *Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick* within the Mass will take place. Stay tuned to next week's bulletin for more information.

And Finally...

We are in need of more Lectors and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion for our weekend masses. I would like to have two lectors for the weekends- this will help to relieve our current roster of lectors. Furthermore, we can always use more ministers of Holy Communion.
