### **Divine Mercy Minute:**

*“Today I imprudently asked two children if they really had nothing to eat at home. The children, without answering me, walked away from the gate. I understood how difficult it was for them to speak about their poverty, so I went after them in a hurry and brought them back, giving them as much as I had permission for. (1297)*

**Feed your family with love and prayer.** At times life seems like a constant cycle of preparing meals, packing lunches and fixing snacks. We can turn this mundane task into an act of mercy when we deliberately do the cooking with love and prayer. Pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy for your family while you are making dinner. Each time you pray over your stove, you are not only feeding stomachs, but souls. Take time this week to make something special for your family and pray for them as you prepare it. As you prepare food for your family, be sure to remember to the Lord those who go without food.

**Prepare and deliver a meal.** When friends and extended family members, including parish family, are going through a tough time, receiving a hot meal can be a much-needed source of encouragement.

**Send a gift card if you can’t cook for others.** Sending a gift card to local restaurants is a simple way to give a family a hot meal. Another way to help a family going through a hard time is to pay for school lunches if they have children in school.

**Make a sacrifice and donate the money to the poor.** In today’s world, Hunger is a very real and serious problem. Every four seconds a child dies from hunger. Make a sacrifice of some type, such as giving up sweets, take the money saved and give to local parish or charity. Lent and Advent are especially good times to make sacrifices and set money aside for the poor.

**Share a lunch.** Many schools have a subsidized lunch program. When school is closed, some children have a hard time getting a nutritious meal. One simple way to help is to donate nonperishable lunches to a local school or food pantry to be given to those students.
