FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:



Peter, James, and John climb the mountain with Jesus and something very strange happens. After Jesus changes in appearance, Moses and Elijah suddenly are present, speaking with him while the cloud overshadows them and a voice comes out of the cloud. In a matter of seconds, the vision ends.

For the Jewish people, Moses was always symbolic of the laws of God gave them on Mount Sinai, and Elijah usually represented the prophets. Together, Moses and Elijah in today's gospel stand for "The Law and the Prophets," another name for the Jewish Scriptures.

The purpose of the Scriptures was to help prepare for the coming of the Messiah, a political/military leader through whom God would establish the reign or kingdom. With God ruling the world, there would be no more pain or suffering or death.

The symbolism and the rest of the reading also deals with the reign or kingdom of God. Many Jews believe the saints in the kingdom will wear a bright white clothing and will be in God's presence. In today's Gospel reading, not only does Jesus clothing turn dazzling white but the rest of his being is transformed or transfigured as well. As Jesus converses with Moses and Elijah a cloud overshadows them, a symbol of God's presence because God let the Jews with a column of clouds when they were leaving Egypt.

Finally, Peter offered to put up three booths or tents. Because the Jews lived in tents in the desert on their way to the Promised Land, tents are symbolic of God saving power and the Jews believed that everyone in the kingdom of God will live in one.

Why all the symbolism about the reign of God? As we already said, many Jewish people (including the apostles) were expecting a political/military Messiah who would establish the reign or kingdom of God on earth. Because Jesus obviously wasn't a political/military leader, he use the event in today's gospel to tell the apostles he is indeed the Messiah even though he did not fit the stereotype. With Jesus' death in the near future, the apostles needed this assurance.

Even after experiencing the Transfiguration, The apostle still had difficulty believing in and understanding what Jesus said. We, too, can't sometimes expect to have difficulty believing or understanding what Jesus wants of us. Pray this week for an increase in faith and wisdom.

As I mentioned in last week's bulletin, Lent is the Church's annual, built-in "retreat time." Lent is a time where

we confront those things that separate us from God and each other. The goal and question we ask when all is said and done after the Lenten Season is complete is, "What has changed in my life so that I have been brought closer to Christ?"

As we begin Lent, we're invited to do embrace three disciplines - PRAYER, FASTING and ALMSGIVING. Prayer - to hear God more clearly. Fasting - to empty our desires and to connect with those in need. Almsgiving - thanking God for what we have and to help others less fortunate.

On Monday night at 7:00 PM, the Diocese of Oakland will be having a Safe Environment meeting for all St. Benedict parishioners who participate in ministries that have any contact with minors. This mandatory training and review session was instituted by the U.S. Bishops in response to the clergy sex abuse scandal in 2002. Courses and procedures such as these bring increased insight and awareness to the sexual abuse of minors, and we're invited to be more attuned to this issue not only within our parishes but in our everyday life. For numerous years, I was the priest that worked with clergy sexual abuse victims, hearing and

understanding the pain they endured and the healing they sought. My closest childhood friend was sexually abused by a trusted and respected priest friend. Thank you for your willingness and understanding in participating on Monday night.

I also invite your participation in meeting our Bishop's Appeal goal for 2017.

The Bishop's Appeal material features images from St. Benedict parish, which helps others throughout the Diocese of Oakland see how unique a place we are. Please be generous with your support.

Also note that in Friday's during the Lenten Season, we will be having Stations of the Cross at both 12:00 noon and 6:00 PM. You are welcome to join us as we participate in this traditional Lenten practice!

LENTEN SCHEDULE:

Stations of the Cross

Days of Abstinence:

All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat and meat products for everyone who is fourteen years of age and older. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence (one full meal, two lesser meals, no meat, no eating between meals) to all persons who are between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine.
